Only Partial Exemption Is Proposed to Be Granted.

In connection with the proposal to grant exemption to the look through the classified column Prince Rupert Drydock and Engineering Co. it might be well to on Page 5. note that the proposal does not contemplate exempting the Company from what is usually the largest tax in any municipality, that is the local improvement or money bylaw tax. The company will have to take its share with the rest of the community when it comes to borrowing money. The city treasurer insisted on this right being maintained in order to retain unimpaired the credit of the city. It is a very important point to consider when voting on the bylaw which will be before the people on Thursday.

Should Grant Land For Soldier Memorial.

The bylaw to grant a plot of land to the Great War Veterans Association for a memorial building which will be used as a clubhouse for the returned men and a home for those wounded men who need it, is worthy of favorable consideration. The land belongs to the city and is not being used. The soldiers are prepared to use it for a public purpose to fulfill a public duty. The citizens should back them in their work and grant the land freely so that a memorial may be built. The News is not in favor of marble one monuments just now. There is too much need for other things. A useful monument is the correct thing, and that is what the Veterans propose.

Another Nail In Bowser's Political Coffin.

The election of Major R. J. Burde, M. C., is another nail in the political coffin of W. J. Bowser, leader of the opposition in the Provincial Legislature. Major Dick has sworn eternal enmity to the late premier and he will certainly use his influence to have another more fit person selected for the leadership of the party. The Major is elected as an independent, although he has always been a Conservative and doubtless will have strong leanings to that party again. It must be under another leader, however. He is strongly of the opinion that no party can expect to secure the confidence of the public unless it is well led.
