PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given to the Electors of the Municipality of the City of Prince Rupert, that I hereby require the presence of the City Clerk's Office, in the City Hall, City of Prince Rupert, on Monday the 13th day of January, A.D. 1919, at 12 o'clock noon, to be in the form of a meeting to present them in the Municipal Council as Mayor and Aldermen.

QUALIFICATION FOR SCHOOL TRUSTEE. I am notified by the Secretary of the School Board that it will be necessary to hold an election for three trustees to serve for a term of two years, to take the places of Mrs. Elizabeth C. Kirkpatrick, L. W. Patmore and George Munro, whose term expires in 1919. It will be necessary that nominations be handed to the Returning Officer at the time and place as in the case of Mayor and Aldermen provided by Statute, as set out above, and that a declaration showing his qualification in the manner as provided for Mayor and Aldermen.

QUALIFICATION FOR CANDIDATES FOR MAYOR. The qualification for a candidate for Mayor is that the said candidate shall be a person who is a British subject of the full age of 21 years, not disqualified under any law and who has for the six months next preceding the day of nomination, been the registered owner in the Land Registry Office of land or real property in the City of Prince Rupert to the assessed value, on the last Municipal Assessment Roll of \$500.00 or more, and above any registered judgment or charge, and who is otherwise duly qualified as a Municipal Voter.

QUALIFICATION FOR CANDIDATES FOR ALDERMEN. The qualification for a candidate for Aldermen is that the said candidate shall be a person who is a British subject of the full age of twenty-one years, not disqualified under any law and who has for the six months next preceding the day of nomination, been the registered owner in the Land Registry Office in the City of Prince Rupert of land or real property in the City of Prince Rupert to the assessed value, on the last Municipal Assessment Roll of \$200.00 or more, and above any registered judgment or charge, and who is otherwise duly qualified as a Municipal Voter.

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ELECTION OF POLICE COMMISSIONERS AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that under the provisions of the Municipal Act, Amendment Act—1917, I require the presence of the Electors at the place and time above mentioned, for the purpose of electing one person who shall serve on the Board of Commissioners of Police, to take the place of George Hill, whose term expires in 1919. BYLAW TO AUTHORIZE THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PRINCE RUPERT TO GRANT EXEMPTION FROM CERTAIN TAXES TO THE PRINCE RUPERT DRYDOCK AND ENGINEERING COMPANY LIMITED. WHEREAS, the Prince Rupert Drydock and Engineering Company Limited, a company duly incorporated in the Province of British Columbia proposes to operate a shipbuilding plant and other industrial enterprises in the City of Prince Rupert.
