## SPECTACULAR BLAZE CAUSES MUCH DAMAGE

Fire Destroys Over a Million Dollars' Worth of Property At Montreal.

(Special via G. T. P. Telegraphs.)  
Montreal, January 13.—Over a million dollars' damage was caused yesterday by a spectacular fire which destroyed the plant of Jennings & Co., Wellington St. One hundred and forty automobiles, including nine ambulances to the order of the Canadian government and ready for shipment were a total loss, and the premises of the Hudson's Bay Co., and S. J. Carter & Co. were seriously damaged when the flames spread temporarily beyond control of the firemen, at one time leaping clear across the street and setting ablaze the premises of the Hudson's Bay Co. at 58 McGill street.
