### Being on Time One of Virtues.

Prince Rupert people usually are not on time. Very few of the public affairs start on time and private or semi-private events are even worse. It seems to be understood that if an event is timed for nine, ten is intended. So it is throughout. Sometimes events are only a few minutes late, but very few start on time. There are one or two notable exceptions such as the City Council. There Mayor McClymont makes a point of starting on the tick and the result is that the aldermen arrive on time.

Now that there is a prospect of the city growing and new people coming it would be well to try to get in line with the rest of the world and have meetings start on time. The same applies to office hours in business houses and those employed generally. No man can look for much promotion or even to hold a good job long if he is not down on time in the morning. It is one of the essentials. An hour in the morning is worth two in the afternoon. Anyone who is not on hand when the rest of the staff commences upsets the work and causes any amount of inconvenience. Not only that but he has a bad influence on the others, and if allowed to continue eventually disorganizes the whole staff. Promptness is an essential in commercial life and is just as important in a small town as in a big one.

### Peace Conference Making Progress.

The Peace Conference seems to be making first rate progress and Mr. Wilson seems to be having his way to a large extent, in spite of many prophecies that when he got against the big men of Europe he would find he had not much influence. The League of Nations seems likely to be an accomplished fact and when it and the general principles of the territorial limits have been passed on the chief work of the President of the United States will have been finished and he may return home.

### Will Wilson Be Candidate Again?

One of the topics of conversation in the United States and Canada is whether Wilson will seek a third term as President. Those who seem to know the president best think he will not make the attempt as it would be fatal, but others fancy that the hope of the party would be for him to make a good showing at the Peace Conference and then seek the nomination on the strength of it. As the election is so far away, however, and so many things may happen in that time, it is hardly likely that the Peace Conference and the European settlement will have any effect on the next presidential election.

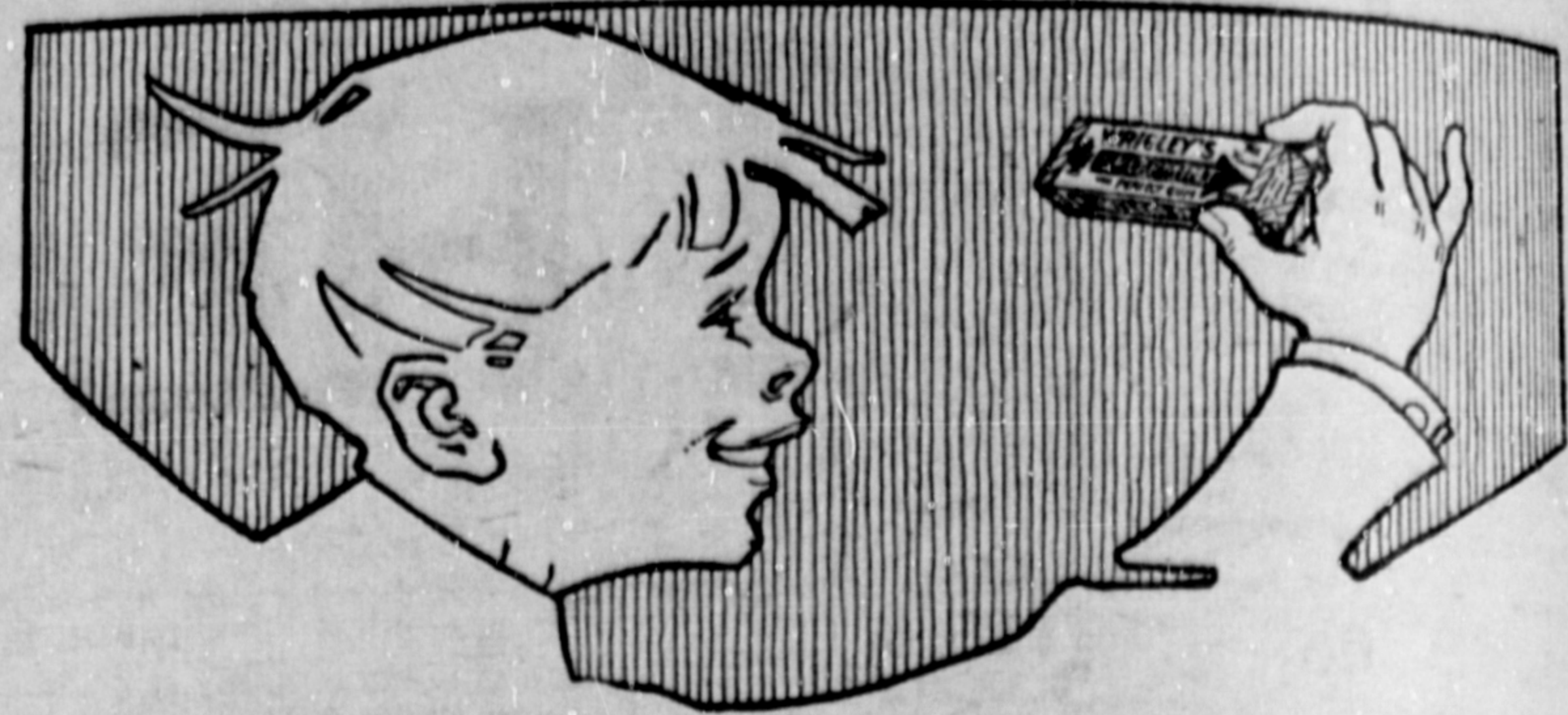
