REPAIRING A WATCH In the diagnosis of tuberculosis at the clinics which he conducted throughout the province, Dr. Lamb stressed the important part that the x-ray played. While his own salary was paid by the government, the expenses of his nurse, herself a public health nurse with special training in tuberculosis, and of the x-ray was met by the sale of Christmas seals by the Tranquille Publishing Co. which had been raising on the average about \$5000 annually by this means which nicely covered the work. Dr. Lamb, in closing, made an appeal for co-operation in the purchasing of these tuberculosis


