A marriage of much local interest was that on Saturday of Lieutenant R. L. Clothier, of the Canadian Engineers, son of Ambrose Clothier, of Kemptonville, Ontario, Canada, to Miss Patty Margaret Harding, eldest daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J. Reginald Harding, Sellarsbrook, near Monmouth, says the Monmouthshire Beacon, of recent date. The ceremony took place at the church of St. Dubricius, Whitechurch. The officiating clergy were the Rev. Canon Harding, R. D., grandfather of the bride, and the Rev. O. Thomas rector of Whitechurch. The church was filled with many friends and well-wishers, the family of the bride being widely known in this county and the adjoining county of Hereford and the best of good wishes go out to the bride and bridegroom from their large circle of acquaintances.

The Dresses.

The bride was given away by her father. She looked very pretty in a dress of draped white satin, with a short tunic of georgette, ending in a cape at the back, weighted with silver tassels. She also wore a tulle veil and wreath of white heather and orange blossom and carried a bouquet of white carnations and heather. Full Choral.
