## Initiative and The Referendum.

The speech from the throne intimates that the Government is about to fulfill another of its promises to the electorate by bringing in a measure at the present session of the Legislature to provide for the referendum on important measures and the initiative for those who wish legislation which the Government is not prepared to submit. That puts the law making more in the hands of the people than it has ever before been. It is the most democratic measure that any Canadian Government has ever introduced.

Only a few years ago even Liberals looked upon the referendum and the initiative as two visionary measures, pleasant to talk about but not within the realm of practical politics. Shortly before the last provincial elections it was adopted as part of the platform of the party, but even yet many would not believe that it would ever be implemented into legislation. There seemed to be a prevalent idea that it was simply a catch vote plank inserted to please the trades unionists and more socialistic members of the community.

## Government Will Be Absolutely Democratic.

With the giving of the franchise to women and the submission of important measures to a vote of the people the Government of this province becomes absolutely democratic. The people may now do almost anything, as long as it comes within the powers of the province. It is as democratic a form as a soviet. If the workingmen want to take charge of the Government they can easily do so by getting a majority of the electors to support them. As a matter of fact this Liberal Government with Farmer John Oliver at its head is already pretty much a workingmen's government.

It will be interesting to find out just what the Government intends to do in connection with the changes in the Prohibition Act, but it is supposed to be about to make changes that will make the bone dry act rather dryer than it is at present. In view of the recent action of the United States in bringing total prohibition into force there, it is unthinkable that there could be any reversion to former conditions.

## Air Service Development.

Yesterday's news dispatches contained two interesting announcements in regard to developments of the air service. One of these was the purchase of ten million dollars' worth of equipment from the British Government by an American for commercial purposes, and the other the consideration of the feasibility of an air service between Victoria and Vancouver for carrying passengers and mail.

If it is found practicable to run an air service over the eighty miles between the capital of B. C. and the chief industrial centre we shall soon have an air service to this city. That will save building roads. It will be quite easy to leave work at five o'clock and dine with friends at Terrace, or make a business visit to Smithers during the afternoon and return in time to put the plane in the drome before dark. The possibilities are limitless if only there is money enough behind the desire. Those who find the rough sea a terror will find it much pleasanter to cross to Buckley Bay by plane than to take the Prince John, comfortable and pleasant as she may be for a boat of her size.

## Million Men to Police Europe.

Nine hundred thousand British soldiers will be needed to police Germany and other enemy countries for some time to come. The other millions will return to their homes. All Canadians probably will return home, for Canada is better able to take care of her returned men than is Great Britain. Over there it will be a stupendous matter, getting the men back into civil life. With the building of warships stopped, ammunition plants shut down and with no more manufacture of war materials it is difficult to understand what the people will do. Many of them, doubtless, will come to Canada, and it would seem reasonable to think that the British Government may send many of them here.
