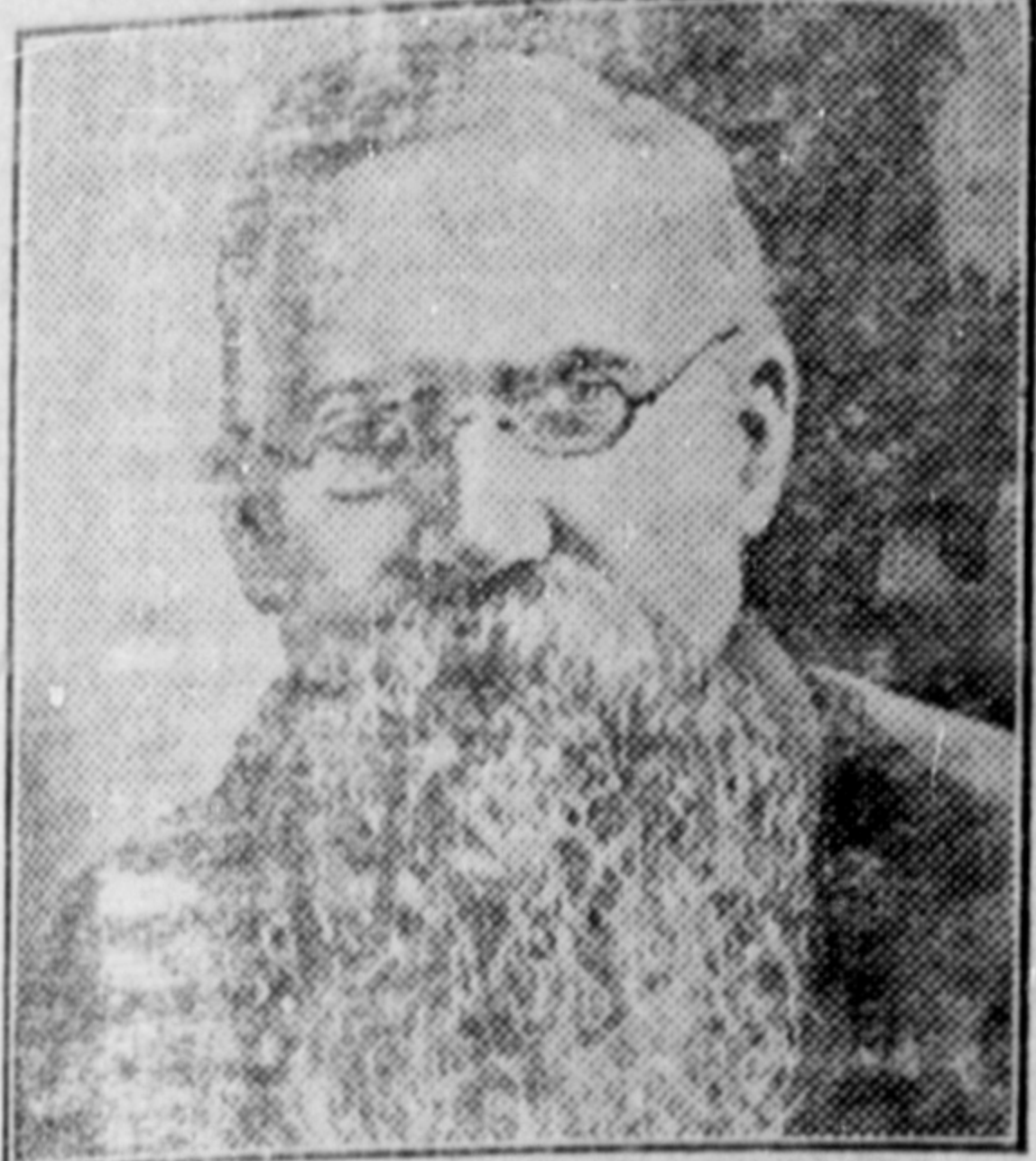

FOOD PRICES WILL TUMBLE BEFORE LONG

Cancellation of Contracts and Virtual Embargo on Export Will Cause Drop.

Ottawa, Jan. 30.—Rumors of an early tumble in food prices are finding their way into the Dominion from across the boundary. The cancellation of Allied contracts for various commodities and the practical cessation for the time being of shipping from Canada, which acts as a virtual embargo against exports, is leading to the expectation that the heavy stocks of foodstuffs at present in the Dominion are due for a drop in prices.

PROTEST AGAINST ANY CENSORSHIP OF SPEECH AND PRESS

Trades and Labor Council Call Mass Meeting; Officers Elected on Tuesday Evening.

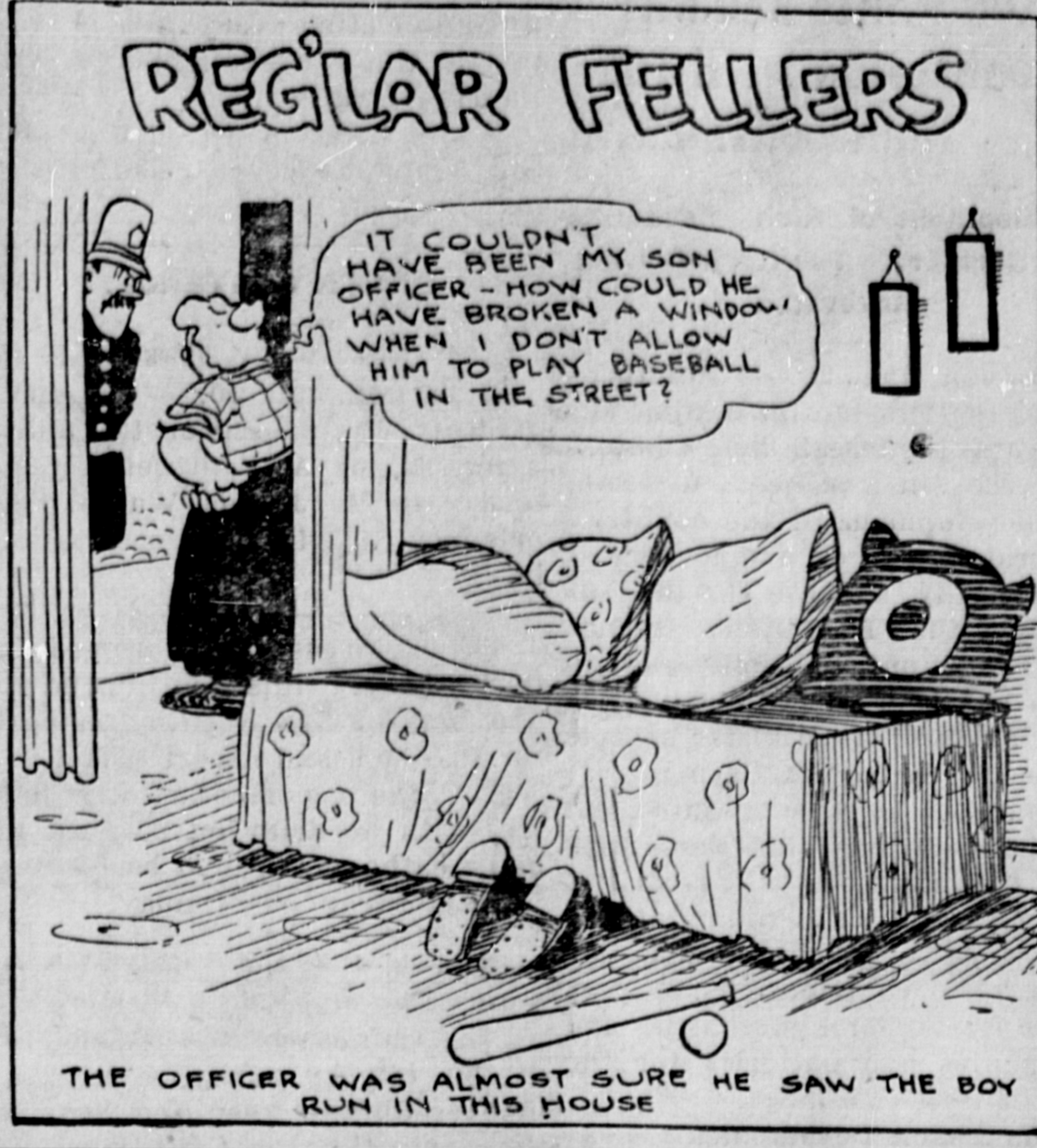
The Prince Rupert Trades and Labor Council will co-operate in a Dominion-wide movement to protest against the censorship of speech and press. With this purpose a mass meeting will be called on Sunday, February 2, in Carpenters' Hall. The request to the local Council to join came from the Alberta Federation of Labor, and was read at the largely attended meeting on Tuesday night, W. E. Thompson presiding. A communication from the local G. W. V. A. requesting a delegate to attend a public meeting in the interest of their memorial site was read and President Thompson was chosen to represent the Council. Another letter from the same body saying that they had appointed a committee of five members asking the Council to do likewise, the joint committee to meet from time to time, was read and W. E. Thompson, Fred Staw, Geo. Rudderham, L. Dawson and S. V. Cox were appointed.

After a keen contest the following officers were elected: President, W. E. Thompson; vice-pres., S. V. Cox; general secretary, Geo. Rudderham; treasurer, W. Reid; statistician, John Rank; sergeant-at-arms, John Watson; executive, president and secretary and J. J. Gillis, S. V. Cox and Fred Shaw; legislative committee, W. A. Polford, L. Dawson, J. Ellis, George Waddell, W. Reid; finance committee, W. A. Polford, L. Dawson and F. W. Grimble.
