Mineral Collection At Mines Office.

Many mining men are not aware perhaps that at the office of the District Mining Engineer there is a very fine collection of minerals and rocks from which minerals are obtained. In all there are 125 specimens of rock and 200 specimens of minerals. These are open to inspection of any mining men at any time and the Engineer, George Clothier, is always ready to explain anything in regard to them that is not clear and to give advice to prospectors and miners.

Prospectors who have been out in the hills should take their samples to the office and make comparisons in order that they may be better equipped for the next trip.

Coming Back to The Home Town.

Municipal committees to welcome home the Canadian men from overseas have already been formed in several of the leading cities and in some of the smaller municipalities, says the Ottawa Citizen editorially. The Union of Canadian Municipalities is co-operating with the Repatriation Committee. It is expected that every municipality will form an honorary committee of citizens, composed of men and women who will assume a measure of responsibility in this work of giving a welcome to the returning men and their dependents, in helping men to secure employment when they are discharged from the army, and generally in assisting them to re-establish themselves in civil life.

It apparently does not matter so much what the name of the local committee may be, so long as it is broadly representative of the community, and actively helping. In the municipalities where committees have not yet been formed, and men of the Canadian citizen army are coming home, the representative of the Union of Canadian Municipalities is urging that the citizens should get together for the purpose of organizing the welcome back to the home town. The functions of the "Welcome Home" Committee, according to the circular letter, should be as follows:

Duties of Committee Succinctly Set Forth.

- (1) To welcome all returned soldiers and their dependents on their arrival in your locality.
- (2) To receive any complaints from returned soldiers and to forward them to the Department of Soldiers' Civil Re-establishment, Ottawa, for investigation.
- (3) To help the returned soldiers to find employment.
- (4) If at any time employment cannot be found in your locality for a returned soldier, to report particulars to the Department of Soldiers' Civil Re-establishment.
- (5) If positions exist in your locality for which returned soldiers are not available, to notify the Department of Soldiers' Civil Re-establishment, so that men can be sent from the nearest demobilization centre to occupy them.
- (6) To co-operate with voluntary organizations.
- (7) To keep a general oversight over the interests of returned soldiers and their families.

The Repatriation Committee, it is stated, will be only too glad to answer any inquiries which may be made by the municipalities with regard to those problems which come within its scope. The steps taken by the government to establish co-operation between the Union of Canadian Municipalities and the Repatriation Committee seem to be highly commendable. Municipalities have a most important part to play, and duty to perform, in making the welcome real and permanent and practical to the Canadian men who left home, to give their lives if needs be, at the call of duty.
