

When it is seen, however, that the general trend of wages is downward and that the company cannot operate on the low-grade ore at the present cost, better counsels may prevail and the men may decide to continue.

Word has been received here that the Granby people have given notice of a reduction of wages at Grand Forks to correspond with the cut here.


