The St. George's Society has discovered an interesting fact |* that in spite of the fact that the greater part of the fighting during the war was done by Englishmen, there is not a real Englishman sitting in the Peace Conference. Lord Milner is the only one who goes by that name and he is of German grandparentage on one side, was born in Germany, and his father lived most of his active life in Germany. Of the other members of the conference there is one Welshman, Mr. Lloyd George; one Scottish Canadian, Mr. Bonar Law; one Jew, Mr. Reading; four Scotsmen, Mr. Balfour, Sir Eric Geddes, Marshal Haig, and Admiral Wemyss; one Englishman, Lord Milner.


