## TOUR PARTY IS COMING

Across Canada Group Due in Prince Rupert Next Week

VANCOUVER, July 29: Combining transportation methods by land, water and air, the second Across Canada Tour conducted by the Canadian National Railways will arrive in Vancouver on Sunday morning. A matter of 21 days have been allotted to this tour and more than 8,000 miles covered.

This party travelled from Eastern Canada via the Great Lakes and came west to the coast via Banff and Lake Louise. After spending the Sunday morning in Vancouver the members of the party will journey Friday, July 29, 1932 to Victoria where they will pay a visit to the famous Butchart Gardens returning to Vancouver again on Monday morning. On Monday evening they sail for Prince Rupert, arriving there Wednesday morning and will return to their homes in Eastern Canada after a short stay at Jasper Park Lodge and Minaki Lodge enroute.


