No Profits Without Possible Losses.

In most of the Canadian cities the dealers in the city market are confined to the sale of home productions. They do not buy imported goods and retail them. The bill is not in the usual sense a Government measure. 1919. Any powers which are given to or taken from municipalities are not therefore the work of parties, but of the legislature as a whole.
