### Increased Scope For City Market.

What is going to happen if the market clerk goes broke on his trading, under the proposal of Alderman Casey and Alderman Barrie? The plan which was published yesterday provides that he shall be bonded for \$4,000 so that it is to be presumed that the bonding company is expected to meet the loss in case of failure. It is not, however, a reasonable presumption. No bonding house would bond a firm against losses in business. There are too many failures for that.

If it were as easy to go into business as Alderman Casey seems to intimate and on a seven and a half per cent. margin make money without investing any capital, then why is not the alderman in business himself? He could soon make a fortune. Alderman Barrie who is sponsor to the motion knows that he gets a very much higher margin than seven and a half per cent. or even four times that, yet he does not make a fortune.

### No Profits Without Possible Losses.

The city will find it difficult to make any agreement by which it is to make profits without at the same time suffer the risk of having losses. Business is a venture. It means loss as often as profit. Many firms go to the wall and others lose money periodically and then catch up again when good times come. There is little stability except in an old established business where the manager has unusual ability.

The idea of the aldermen to try to save money for the citizens is all right, but they seem to pre-suppose that the merchants now in business are getting more than their share of profits. As a matter of fact more than one firm dealing in food-stuffs is losing money today. For the city to go into a business in a large way means simply forcing some of the merchants to the wall.

### Procedure in Other Cities.

In most of the Canadian cities the dealers in the city market are confined to the sale of home productions. They do not buy imported goods and retail them. The whole idea behind the establishment is for those who produce in a small way to get into direct touch with the consumer and thus get the full product of their toil. In Victoria and Vancouver the prices at the market are usually about the same as at the city stores, often higher than at the "cash and carry stores." There is, however, an attraction about buying direct from the farmers that brings business their way.

In Seattle fruit is often cheaper in the markets than in the stores and cheaper in the farmers' markets than in the others. On the whole, however, the difference is only the difference of delivery or no delivery.

Here there are no farmers to bring produce to market. The only farmers are those who live a hundred miles away. The result is that there is little to be gained in extending the market. The city is hardly big enough yet for any great extension at any rate.

### Municipal Act Must Be Watched.

F. A. McDiarmid, former city solicitor of Victoria, has prepared a new draft municipal act which will possibly be before the legislature this session. There are many who think it would be better to hold it over until it is thoroughly digested, as it contains many new provisions. Prince Rupert is vitally interested in this legislation and just now during her growing time it seems as if she particularly needs to be on her guard against any move which might handicap her.

The bill is not in the usual sense a Government measure. The Municipal Committee, which is composed of members from both sides of the House, has power to amend or reject clauses and also to add additional ones. It is usually understood that a measure of this kind is not in any sense of the word a party measure. Any powers which are given to or taken from municipalities are not therefore the work of parties, but of the legislature as a whole.

If Mr. Johnson, city treasurer, goes to Victoria and meets the legislative committee he will find that he will get a respectful hearing and every question will be considered on its merits. That is all that can be asked.
