Abolish War Tax On All Commodities.

A press dispatch yesterday hinted that the Dominion Government might decide to abolish the five per cent. war tax on the British preference and the seven and a half per cent. war tax on other importations into this country.

To do that would be little enough, but it would be better than nothing. The tariff against the United States should certainly come down. It is much too high. A reciprocal arrangement by which all or nearly all of the tariff might be taken off would be most acceptable to the west.

Many of the best citizens in Prince Rupert are Americans. They live here and help build up the country, but they have to pay almost fifty per cent. more for many of the things they need just because of that tariff wall.

Some time ago a news dispatch suggested that many of the larger manufacturers would be glad to invade the U. S. Market. They did not like being confined to a population of less than eight million as prospective customers.

Waiting for Land Settlement Development.

Spring days are reminding people in this part of the world that there are still many thousands of acres in the country between Prince Rupert and Prince George that are awaiting settlement. Broad valleys of the richest land in the world are there, but settlers are few.

Happily the Provincial Government has itself taken the initiative in making such changes in the Land Settlement Board as will tend to strengthen it. Now the people are looking for results. Unless there is a big influx of settlers on to the lands this summer there will have to be other changes. The government positively must insist that results be obtained and that quickly.

Work of Banks Of Value to Country.

It is the fashion to criticize the banks. They are earning too much, they hold back development, they refuse to lend unless there is good security back of it. These are the sort of criticisms that are heard. Sometimes they are true, for the banks are more or less human institutions although they are sometimes classed as inhuman.

Sir Edmund Osler, president of the Dominion Bank, recently said:

"Canada today is furnishing the public with banking facilities that are not equalled by any country in the world, and are indeed not warranted, either by present conditions or probable future expansion. From the last available returns Canada has a branch bank for every 2,300 people; in the United States, including national and state banks, there is one for every 3,600 people, and in the United Kingdom one for every 4,800."

This statement seems to indicate that the banks are giving good service.
