FORMER RUPERTITE LOSES HER DIAMONDS

Mrs. Nan L. Handasyde Victim of Robbery of Rings Valued At \$3,000.

Four diamond rings valued at \$3,000, \$50 in cash and two negotiable notes aggregating \$570, were stolen today from the automobile of Mrs. Nan L. Handasyde, 734 Valencia street, formerly proprietor of a beauty parlor at 2727 West Seventh street, according to her report to the police, says a Los Angeles paper.

Mrs. Handasyde told the police that she missed the rings and other valuables, which were in a small black handbag, within less than five minutes after leaving her automobile in the Westcott garage, 1320 West Seventh street.

She furnished the police with a description of two men who are said to have been the only persons in the garage when she left the machine. The missing handbag, Mrs. Handasyde said, was taken from the front seat of the automobile.

One of the rings is said to be a family heirloom. It is described as having "a setting of six large stones" and is valued by Mrs. Handasyde at more than \$1,000.
