### LITTLE CHANGE

Eggs Drop Another Ten Cents,  
But Oranges and Apples are  
Becoming Scarce.

There is little change in the local market. The price of eggs has dropped another ten cents, but the present cold snap may possibly have the effect of bringing them up again.

The new leaf lettuce has arrived from California and is selling at five cents a bunch. This and celery are the only salads on the market just now.

Oranges are becoming scarcer every day and are likely to rise in price. For those who make marmalade, however, there are some fine Seville oranges on sale at the stores, retailing at 75c a dozen.

Good eating apples are getting very scarce. The quality is not as good as it was. Some of the Newton pippins, however, are keeping very well and are in demand. The price of eating apples is from \$3.50 to \$4 a box.

## UNITED STATES IS SPENDING MUCH MONEY

Great preparations for the construction of public works and for general building activities in the spring are being made in the United States. In addition to the survey being conducted by the field men of the Division of Public Works and Construction of the United States Department of Labor, the Kelly and Kenyon Bills have been introduced in Congress to provide heavy appropriations for national constructive activities. Each measure calls for an appropriation of \$100,000,000.

The Kenyon Bill, in addition, empowers the War Finance Corporation to make advances, within one year from the passage of the Act, to an aggregate amount not exceeding \$300,000,000, at not less than 5 per cent per annum to any state for financing public works whenever unusual unemployment is actual or threatened.
