Fishermen Refuse

To Sign Agreement.

The fishermen who operate the trawlers are taking a holiday while the big boats are being overhauled. The holiday has already of lasted a month and there seems to be no sign of the boats going near the big Canyon. out. The weather certainly is not propitious as yet but there is no income for the men or the boats while the operations are stopped.

The difficulty is that the old agreement between the fishermen and the boat owners has expired and the men refuse to sign up again on the same terms.


