Splendid Price for Provincial Bonds.

That the British Columbia Government is inspiring confidence in the financial world is apparent from the fact that three million dollars' worth of their bonds bearing an interest rate of five and a half per cent. have been sold for practically par. The exact price was 99.32.

When it is considered that Canadian Government Victory bonds had to be made free of income tax in order to market them it is clear that B. C. securities are now looked upon as good as Dominion securities. It speaks very highly for the economic management of the affairs of the province that from a condition of bankruptcy she has been brought to a place where the money magnates of the world again look on her with confidence.

Playground for School Children.

In a lecture last night in the Presbyterian Church Principal Brady of the High School drew attention to the lack of playgrounds in the city. He showed that play was just as important as work as a factor in the development of the child. To have to play on the streets was not good for children. Playgrounds should be provided at any price for they are a modern necessity.

At King Edward school there is a playground that could be made useful with the expenditure of a little money. Like ventilation and other health conditions this is a matter on which it does not pay to be penurious. Money spent on playgrounds is better than on any other school equipment.

Play is the natural outlet for the activities of the child. Forbidden play, the child fails to develop normally and eventually the inclination is to drift into the criminal ranks and eventually to help fill the jails.

Factor in Creating Bolsheviks Here.

The greatest factor in the creation of Bolsheviks in this country is the action of such men as Flavelle in profiteering while the country is struggling for freedom. The noble boys who went overseas at the pay of a dollar and ten cents a day and many of whom gave their lives for freedom did not think that while they were freeing the world from the Huns the people at home were being enmeshed by those at home. There can be no liberty here while men in high positions are able to accumulate hoards such as that mentioned in Parliament by Sir Sam Hughes. Compare that with the paltry dollar ten a day that the boys were getting at the same time for doing vastly more important work, and it is evident that something is wrong. It is not a matter of party politics. It is a matter that must be righted by no matter what party is in power. The general opinion expressed is that hanging is much too easy a punishment for a man who could sap the life blood from the nation at a time when the young men were fighting for liberty.

FINANCE DEPARTMENT. DOMINION INCOME WAR TAX ACT TO WHOM APPLICABLE.

Every person who in 1918 resided or ordinarily resided in Canada or was employed in Canada or carried on business in Canada, including corporations and joint stock companies.

WHO SHOULD FILE RETURNS.

1. Every unmarried person or widow or widower, without dependent children under twenty-one years of age, who during calendar year 1918 received or earned \$1,000 or more.
2. All other individuals who during calendar year 1918 received or earned \$2,000 or more.
3. Every corporation and joint stock company whose profits exceeded \$3,000, during the fiscal year ended in 1918.

FORMS TO BE FILLED IN AND FILED.

- FORM T1. By individuals, other than farmers and ranchers.
FORM T1A. By farmers and ranchers.
FORM T2. By corporations and joint stock companies.
FORM T3. By trustees, executors, administrators of estates and assignees.
FORM T4. By employers to make return of the names of all directors, officials, agents or other employees to whom was paid \$1,000 or more in salaries, bonuses, commission or other remuneration during the calendar year 1918.
FORM T5. By corporations, joint stock companies, associations and syndicates to make return of all dividends and bonuses paid to shareholders and members during 1918.
Individuals comprising partnerships must file returns in their individual capacity.

GENERAL INFORMATION

All returns must be filed IN DUPLICATE.
Forms may be obtained from the Inspectors and Assistant Inspectors of Taxation and from the Postmasters at all leading centres.
Returns should be filed immediately.
Postage must be prepaid on letters and other documents forwarded by mail to Inspectors of Taxation.
