BIGGEST CATCH FOR FEBRUARY OF ANY YEAR

More Boats Called Here and More Halibut Sold Than During Former Similar Period.

824,800 LBS. SOLD HERE IN TWENTY-EIGHT DAYS

February of this year showed the biggest catch of halibut that has ever been landed during the month. No less than 824,800 lbs. passed through this port to the eastern market. It is a splendid record and is an indication of what may follow.

What makes the present record so outstanding is not only the fact that more fish was marketed here than in any previous February but that during that time the fishing boats of the Canadian Fish and Cold Storage Co. were tied up because the men refused to continue under the old agreement. Also other company boats were tied up so that if they had been working another hundred thousand pounds might have been added to the catch.

For the year 1917 the halibut marketed here amounted to 809,000 lbs.; in 1918 it was 619,000 lbs., and this year it was 824,800 pounds.

In 1918, 54 boats tied up here whereas this year in the month of February 76 boats tied up.

Price Comparison.
 On February 1, 1917, the prices obtained were 12½c. for number 1, and half that price for number 2; in 1918 the price was 17½c. and this year it was 15 6-10 and 12c for seconds.

On February 28, 1917, the price was 12½c.; on the same date in 1918 it was 17½c. and this year it was 13c. with 9.6c for seconds. Previous to this year the price of seconds was half that of first-class fish.
