ANYOX GOES UP IN AIR OVER STATEMENTS OF HAWTHORNTHWAIT

Sends Dispatch to Vancouver to Disprove "Slave Pen" Story Published in Papers.

Strong exception is being taken here not only by Granby Consolidated Mining officials, but also by the population generally, that they are living in "slave pens," as described by J. H. Hawthornthwaite, member for Newcastle, in the legislature last week, says a dispatch from Anyox to the Vancouver Province. Anyox is one of the few "closed towns" of British Columbia, and its residents declare that they take a pride in civic matters that would do credit to much larger cities and more pretentious municipalities.

It is pointed out that during the war Anyox sent nearly 300 men to the war and that at the last Victory Loan drive Anyox subscribed more than half a million dollars, having a greater per capita of subscriptions than any other point in the Dominion of Canada. Patriotic and tobacco funds, Red Cross and every other fund which contributed to the winning of the war found loyal supporters in Anyox.

Placing Returned Men.
Not content with its pre-war record, Anyox is taking back every returned soldier who had a position with the company at the time of his enlistment. The general order is "that a place must be found for every returned man."

The cost of living at Anyox during the past four years has been cheaper than any other place similarly or more favorably situated, either in the United States or Canada, owing to the fact that huge supplies are purchased and resold to the employees to the extent that every year shows a deficit in the storekeeper's accounts, which loss is absorbed by the Granby Consolidated.

Referring to the statement of Major McIntosh in the legislature that as American capital is invested largely it followed that American supplies would be purchased, it is pointed out that with a differential of 35 to 40 per cent. on duty of such supplies, the argument used does not bear conviction, it is said.

Buys in Canada.
"There is not an item of purchases made by this company outside of Canada that can be filled within the confines of this Dominion," declared a prominent official of the company. "Aside from certain machinery, which is not manufactured in Canada, not a penny is spent in the United States for supplies which can be purchased here."

With reference to the statement made in the legislature that the "closed towns" are prohibiting the entry of tradesmen other than those controlled by the Granby company, it is pointed out that commodities are now purchasable here cheaper than they would if placed on any other basis, for with competition upward the company's store would either be obliged to sell at advanced prices or stand the odium of being called to account for "freezing out" smaller concerns.
