REV. FATHER M'GRATH TO SEE HIS BROTHER CONSECRATED BISHOP

Goes to Seattle Where Ceremony Will Take Place at St. James Cathedral.

Rev. Father McGrath left yesterday for Seattle by the S. S. Princess Mary to attend the consecration of his brother, Right Rev. Joseph McGrath, formerly pastor of St. Patrick's church, to the Bishopric of Baker City, Ore. The ceremony will take place in St. James' Cathedral, Seattle, the consecrating prelates being Rt. Rev. Bishop O'Dea of Seattle, and Rt. Rev. Bishop Carroll, of Helena, Montana. The Most Rev. Archbishop Christie of Portland, will preach for the occasion.

Speaking of the appointment of Father McGrath, the Seattle P.I. says:

"As the climax of twenty-three years of successful church work Rev. Joseph F. McGrath received unofficial notice yesterday that he had been appointed by Pope Benedict bishop of the diocese of Eastern Oregon, with the bishopric see at Baker City. Father McGrath is priest of the St. Patrick's parish, of which he has been the head for twelve years. His appointment to the diocese of 55,000 square miles in a rapidly developing district is a recognition by the church authorities of his unusual capacity for executive and financial work.

"The notification came as a complete surprise to Father McGrath and not an inkling as to the probability of such an appointment had previously been given him."

"TARZAN OF THE APES" IS A WONDERFUL STORY

Pictures of Wild Jungle Life Shown at Westholme Tonight Are Intensely Realistic.

"Tarzan of the Apes" is bully adventure. Wild beasts roam through the scenes; a kindly elephant takes the wild man upon his back; in short, mix Stevenson's "Treasure Island" with Captain Baker's African stories and the happy combination is struck. The joy of the film lies in its kindly wild life rather than its civilized brutality. And in putting Burrough's story into the film the National Film Corporation has shown good sense of showmanship. "Tarzan" is better than most films which have been concocted for the screen. Natural beauties, imagination and clean, free spirit make the film a delight.

Tarzan, as readers of the story will remember, is the son of Lord Greystoke, who went to Africa on a secret mission for the British Government. Africa in 1897 was torn by European ravishers, the atrocities in the Belgian Congo, Jameson's raid on the Boers; slave trading, with its concomitant brutalities by the Arabs.

The sailors mutiny, slay their brutal officers in fair fight and then maroon Lord Greystoke and his wife. A boy is born in the jungle; the mother dies and the baby is carried off by a mother ape, who has just lost her young. The film traces the growth of the boy—half ape, half human—till his twentieth year.

FANNIE WARD STARS AS NOVEL CHARACTER

Girl Brought Up in Seclusion Suddenly Finds Herself Out in the World.

Miss Ward is cast as the daughter of a European resident in China. He has given her the name "Innocent" because his wish was the father of the thought. Drunken and broken character himself his dearest desire is that his daughter may be spared the temptations of the world and grow up to be Innocent in fact as well as name. She is brought up in seclusion behind the walls of the quaint old Chinese garden behind her father's house. Her seclusion is ended by her father's death. He has asked his friend, John Wyndham, to be the girl's guardian.

Wyndham, an honorable man, soon tires of China and goes back to Europe. Here for the first time in her life the girl is brought into contact with the world and its temptations. What happens? To tell would be to spoil the story. The play is at the Empress tonight.

WATER NOTICE USE AND STORAGE

TAKE NOTICE that Pacific Coast Exploration Co., Ltd., whose address is Toronto, Ont., will apply for a license to take and use 200 cubic feet per second and to store 4,000 acre feet or 174,240,000 cubic feet of water out of Cascade and Silver Creeks (streams), also known as draining Long Lake and other small lakes in the vicinity of the Big Missouri Group, which flows in a southerly direction and drains into the Salmon River about one mile south of the International Boundary Line.

The storage-dam will be located at Long Lake and other small lakes adjacent. The capacity of the reservoir to be created is about 200,000,000 cubic ft. and it will flood about 400 acres of land, (all rock). The water will be diverted from the stream at a point about the outlet of Long Lake or a small lake below, at dam site, and will be used for power and mining purposes upon the mine and for tramways and other power lines; described as land not subdivided, except mining claims.

This notice was posted on the ground on the 23rd day of February, 1919. A copy of this notice and an application pursuant thereto and to the "Water Act, 1914," will be filed in the office of the Water Recorder at Prince Rupert.

Objections to the application may be filed with the said Water Recorder or with the Controller of Water Rights, Parliament Buildings, Victoria, B. C., within thirty days after the first appearance of this notice in a local newspaper.

The territory to be traversed is entirely a mining district and is unsuitable for any other purpose. See Mineral Groups, head of Salmon River, Portland Canal, Mining Division.
