Berne, March 13 .- Charges that the assassination of Archduke Francis Ferdinand and his wife, the Duchess of Hohenberg, at Sarajevo June 28, 1914, was the result of a deliberate plot by the late Count Tisza, Hungarian premier, are made in a pamphlet written by a priest who was the spiritual adviser of the Duchess of Hohenberg, according to a Vienna dispatch to the Frankfort Gazette.

The general idea of the pamphlets is that Magyar magnates, with the consent of the Vienna court, wished to get rid of the Archduke, who was extremely disliked and to obtain vengence for the murder at the expense of the Jugo Slavs. He pointed out no "proper" inquiry had ever been made into the tragedy.
