### Permanent Committee On Capital and Labor.

Human rights of labor and the principle of collective bargaining have been recognized in Italy as they are being recognized in Great Britain and the United States. Capt. Angelo Fanelli, a member of the Italian Military Mission now in the United States, is the authority for the statement that only one serious strike has occurred in Italy since the signing of the armistice.

"Three months ago," he says, "a very satisfactory agreement was arrived at between the industrial leaders of the country and representatives of the labor unions. The negotiations resulted in the formation of a permanent committee on which | capital and labor are both represented. The men who have charge are not usually there because they have money, for often they have little, but because they are especially fitted to organize and carry on the work.

In Russia they are proving that it is impossible to carry on without using the best brains of the country for organization. The work is too big for the average man. In this country or any other if there is to be anything approaching industrial socialism all the best heads of the country will have to be enlisted in the of Improvements, for the purpose of obmovement. It will be done by means of co-operation and not by opposition. Capital and labor will gradually merge, and it will probably be by making every man a capitalist and not by destroying capital.


