In the Letter Box

The Education of the Conscience. One of the most pressing needs of the present crisis is the education of the conscience as to our duty to society.

In this function of setting up a standard of conduct conscience is limited by the individual's knowledge as to what is considered a right standard by those with whom he comes into contact-God and Society.


