In the Letter Box

The Education of the Conscience.
One of the most pressing needs
of the present crisis is the educa-
tion of the conscience as to our
duty to society.

The long disputed question as to
whether conscience can be edu-
cated is quickly decided when it
is recognized that conscience has
two distinct functions. Its first
function is to set up for the in-
dividual a standard of conduct.
Its second function is to judge
the conduct of the individual by
this standard. In exercising its
second function conscience is in-
fallible, but in performing its
first function conscience is as
fallible as the individual himself.
In other words conscience tells a
man whether he is acting up to
the light he has or not, but he
may be in need of more light. In
this function of setting up a
standard of conduct conscience
is limited by the individual's
knowledge as to what is con-
sidered a right standard by those
with whom he comes into con-
tact — God and Society.

Social Standpoint.

The child needs very early to
be taught the commandment of
God — "Thou shalt not steal,"
and as he grows older and can
reason he needs to have explain-
ed to him the disastrous effect
stealing would have upon society
if every one stole.

We have been educated in the
past too much from an individ-
ualist standpoint, and taught to
do our best for our own sake
only, under the incentive of per-
sonal gain. We need now to be
educated from the social stand-
point, and taught to do our best
for the common welfare, under
the incentive of mutual service.

A familiar picture rises before
the mind. Half a dozen men are
doing road work in the country,
four are sitting on the fence
smoking and watching the other
two digging. The four consider
it a huge joke to idle away their
time because it is public work.
Had they been working for them-
selves the shovels would have
been lying. The consciences of
these four men need education.
They need to be inspired with the
thought that it would be a far
higher and nobler thing for them
to render faithful and loyal ser-
vice to the whole community,
themselves included, than to work
for themselves alone.

Standard Low.

Our moral standard at present
is so low that it seems to be
taken for granted that in all gov-
ernment and municipal work men
and women will not give as effi-
cient service as though they were
working for some private interest.

The nationalizing of some of
our railways at the present time
makes this a living issue.

It is argued that human nature
will always remain the same, and
that it is useless to try and raise
our moral standard. This would
be to deny the possibility of all
progress, whereas by comparison
of the present with the past and
our own nation with other na-
tions we see that slowly it may
be but surely, through the agency
of the press, the school, and the
church, and under the inspiration
of the Spirit of God — the common
Father of us all, men and women
can be educated to take a broader
outlook and to realize the great
truth that they are called to be —
not parasites living upon others,
but ministering members of so-
ciety.
