INQUIRY BY RATEPAYERS

City Council Asked For Details in Regard to Deal With Rotary Club for Gymnasium Site Lots

The Prince Rupert Ratepayers Association had a letter before the city council last night seeking information as to details of a transaction whereby the Rotary Club has acquired from the city lots at the corner of Third Avenue and McBride Street for gymnasium purposes, the money paid over by the Rotary Club to be used by the city for relief purposes. The Ratepayers' Association wishes to know what is the assessed valuation of the property, what are the charges against it, what price was paid by the Rotary Club and if any agreement was entered into in connection with the sale in regard to exemption from taxes. The Association also inquires as to what is the policy of the council in regard to disposal of property reverted to the city for taxes.

On motion of Ald. Casey, seconded by Ald. Linzey, it was decided to inform the Association as to the exact terms of the transaction and advise it that the council has adopted no fixed policy in regard to disposal of reverted property.

MR. JUSTICE ORDE DIES

Leading Jurist of Ontario Passes Away Last Night in Toronto at Age of 62

TORONTO, Aug. 2.—Hon. John Fosberry Orde, justice of the Court of Appeal in the Supreme Court of Ontario, died here last night. He had been ill for more than a month.

Mr. Justice Orde was originally a Nova Scotian. He was born in Great Village, N.S., in 1870.

Called to the bar in 1891, he began the practice of his profession in Ottawa. He enjoyed a very large practice and specialized in corporation work. He was elected president of the Carleton Bar Association in 1908 and was at one time Honorary Treasurer of the Canadian Bar Association. In 1908 he was appointed a King's Counsel.

Mr. Justice Orde took an active interest in many civic and benevolent enterprises. He was a director of Ashbury College. From 1908 to 1912 he was chairman of the Ottawa Licence Commission. At one time he was honorary secretary of the Victorian Order of Nurses. He was a member of the Council of the St. John Ambulance Association. He also did much to further the work of the Ontario Anti-tuberculosis Association and the Children's Aid Society.

He was an Anglican. At various times he occupied the positions of honorary lay secretary of the Diocese of Ottawa and president of the Laymen's Missionary Movement. In politics he was a Conservative.

An enthusiastic sportsman, Mr. Justice Orde was president of the Royal Canadian Golf Association and vice-president of the Ottawa Golf Club. His favorite recreations were golf, canoeing, fishing and billiards. He belonged to the Rideau, the Ottawa Golf, the Toronto and the Toronto Golf Clubs.

He married Miss Edith Cox in 1892, and had two sons and one daughter.
