# BIG RECEPTION BEING PLANNED FOR COL. PECK

Many Organizations Anxious to Do Him Honor When he Returns to His Home Town.

A joint meeting of the committees appointed by the City Council, the Great War Veterans and the Prince Rupert Unionist Association was held yesterday afternoon to make preliminary arrangements for a proper reception to Lieut.-Col. Peck, V. C., who is expected to arrive here on a visit some time in April.

It was decided that subject to Colonel's approval on the night of his arrival a public reception should be held at the Exhibition Building, that being the only building in town capable of accommodating the crowds who will undoubtedly wish to be present.

On this occasion an address of welcome will be presented by Mayor McClymont and several short speeches made, after which the general reception will take place.

If it is possible for the Colonel to remain over and to take part in other festivities he will be entertained at a banquet by the Great War Veterans and by the local Unionist Association, the local Masons and possibly at lunch by the Canadian Club.

A delegation will go up the line to meet the visitor and all members of the Sixteenth Battalion have been made members of the reception committee. The mayor and Canon Rix, chaplain of the 30th Battalion, are also on the committee.

It will be quite unnecessary to suggest that in this reception everyone shall join, for everyone will wish to be there.

# HOTEL EMPLOYEES HALIBUT FISHING

Determined to take a share in the harvest of the sea three Victorians, all at various dates employees in different departments of the Empress Hotel, have started a partnership in the halibut and associate fisheries off the West Coast banks, says the Victoria Times of recent date.

The leader of the party is Captain T. Exton, who operated his craft out of Grimsby, England, for more than thirty years before coming to this country some six years ago. He was for eighteen years captain of a trawler fleet in the North Sea fisheries, and also a member of the Grimsby Fisheries Board. He has been captain of some well known boats, including the Jessie and Alliance, since coming to this coast.

His partner in the purchase of the T. H. L., a forty-five-foot boat with twelve-foot beam, is G. H. Smith, a well known local fisherman, who has just relinquished his work at the hotel in order to join the enterprise. Mr. Smith will, however, have a new experience with this class of fishing in deep waters.

The third member, B. Senior, is an engineer, and will perform that work on the boat, sharing in the proceeds of the catch.

The boat began its work today, the trial trips having been carried out successfully.

## WATER ACT, 1914.

### RIPARIAN RIGHTS.

NOTICE is hereby given that under the provisions of Section 6 of the Water Act, 1914, every riparian proprietor claiming any right to divert water or to the exclusive use of water for any purpose by virtue only of his being such riparian proprietor is required on or before the first day of June, 1920, to file a statement of claim setting forth the particulars of his claim. Such statements of claim shall be filed in duplicate with the Water Recorder of the Water District in which the water is diverted or used.

After the first day of June, 1920, no right to divert water or to the exclusive use of water for any purpose shall exist by virtue only of any ownership of land.
