

The tendency today is to move fast, whether in language or anything else, and it is just as useless to preach against slang as against the tendencies of the new boy or trict. the new girl. Some take pride in using slang while others take near the big Canyon. pride in abstaining. It is like whiskey, it grows on a person and creates an appetite for itself.
