## OCEAN FREIGHT RATES BEGINNING TO SLUMP

Still Very Highly Compare with What They Were Few Years Ago.

Important reductions in lumber freight rates from Puget Sound, Grays Harbor and Willapa Harbor to the Hawaiian Islands, Valparaiso, Callao, Capetown and other South African ports, have been made since the first of February, according to the weekly freight circular of the Shipowners' Association of the Pacific Coast, with headquarters at San Francisco.

On February 1, the rate from the three Washington districts to the Hawaiian Islands was \$18 to \$20 a thousand board feet. The circular just received gives a new March rate of \$17 to \$18. The rate to Valparaiso and Callao on February 1 was \$45 a thousand board feet. The new rate on February 1 to Capetown and other South African ports was 320 shillings. The new rate is 310 to 320 shillings.

The rates, however, have a long way to go before they will descend anywhere near the level of the freights of 1915. As an example, the rate to Hawaii in those days was \$9.50 a thousand board feet as compared to the end of the war rate of \$18 to \$20 and the new March rate of \$17 to \$18.

No changes have yet been made in the lumber freights to San Francisco, Southern California, New Zealand; Lytleton, Dunedin, Sydney, Melbourne and Adelaide, Australia. The rates to those places remain as follows: To San Francisco, \$7; to Southern California ports, \$8; to Auckland, Wellington, Lytleton, Dunedin and Sydney, \$42.50; to Melbourne and Adelaide, \$48.50.

The fall in the rates to Hawaii, Valparaiso, Callao, Capetown and other South African ports, is expected to stimulate shipping of lumber to those centres from the three Washington districts.

## CAUGHT WOLVES IN MIDST OF CAROUSAL

Twelve Fierce Animals Killed and Many Others Took to Flight.

Joe Chesna, an old-time prospector and miner of the Big Chena arrived in town Sunday for a load of supplies, says the Fairbanks Citizen. Yesterday he narrated how he, with his partner, Andy Batolla, recently killed twelve wolves in a small gulch near their camp.

The attention of the men was attracted by snarling and yelping noises coming from the gulch. Thinking that some of their neighbors' dog teams had run away they went to investigate and found instead of a dog team a large number of big wolves. The band had cornered two moose and were devouring the carcasses. The animals were fighting among themselves over the spoils and that was what attracted the attention of the men.

Hastily putting the guns into action they succeeded in killing quite a number before the band broke and ran. The next morning the men again visited the scene and found nothing but the bones of the moose left, the wolves having returned in the night for their prey.

Joe estimates that there must have been at least a hundred of the ravenous animals in the pack, which is an unusual thing, as scarcely over three to five wolves have ever been noticed together in that section at one time. Three pelts were brought to town, being a source of good revenue as there is a bounty of \$15 on each animal slain and the price of a good pelt is worth considerably more. The average length of the animals was about seven feet from tip to tip.

## CONCRETE VESSEL IS LAUNCHED IN ENGLAND

The Armistice, the first large self-propelled sea-going reinforced concrete vessel to be built in Great Britain, was launched at the yard of the Ferro-Concrete Ship Construction Co., Barrow-in-Furness, on January 6 last. Her principal dimensions are as follows: Draught, when loaded, 15 ft. 5 in; length, between perpendiculars, 205 ft.; breadth, moulded, 32 ft.; depth, moulded, 19 ft. 6 in.; indicated horse-power, 400; speed, about 7 1/2 knots.

The vessel is single-deck cargo steamer, with two holds, the forward one having a total capacity of about 42,000 cubic ft., the after one a capacity of about 21,000 built for Lloyd's and Board of cubic ft. The vessel has been Trade requirements, and is classed A1 experimental. The vessel is rigged as a two-masted fore and aft schooner of the single-deck type, and has straight stem and elliptical stern, a short full poop, 37 ft. long and a top-gallant fore-castle 24 ft. long. The entire hull of the vessel, including the poop, bridge-house and fore-castle, etc., is constructed of reinforced concrete. The accommodation for the captain, officers and engineers is fitted in the poop, and the crew in the fore-castle. A deck-house is built adjoining the boiler casing over the chart-house, and a wireless room, with a steering house over, forming the support for a flying bridge and wheel-house.
