ANNUAL MEETING OF LOCAL YACHT CLUB

Finances Reported in a Healthy
Condition—Officers for Coming
Year are Elected.

The Prince Rupert Rowing and Yachting Club, Ltd., is in a better financial condition than it has been for several years, but there is still a small debt which it is hoped to wipe off soon. This was shown in the report of the secretary at the annual meeting held in the court house last night.

It was decided to get prices on the repainting and recaulking of the Hazelton and if the expense was not too great to have the work done at once. It was also decided to build a new float to replace one of those already there, this work to be done in the late summer or autumn.

Reduce Rates.

In order to encourage row boat owners to take advantage of the club privileges, the rate on row boats was lowered to a dollar a month, it being shown that there was plenty of room for storing more boats, but not much room for launches.

The following officers for the coming season were elected: Hon. president, H. McCall; president, A. T. Parkin; vice-pres., Douglas Stork; secretary-treas., Alex. McRae; directors, H. S. Wallace, W. A. King, A. W. Cameron, Dr. Evans, and H. F. Pullen.

It was suggested that before long there would probably be just as many members of the club as could be accommodated.

INDIAN GIRL FINED SELLING NEAR BEER

Claimed to be Quarter-Breed and
Was Given Job at Liberty
Rooms.

Dorothy Gosnell was brought before C. C. Perry yesterday afternoon on a charge of having liquor in her possession. The accused is an Indian from Port Simpson, and it appears that she took a room at the Liberty rooms, and asked for a job from S. Johnson and J. Balopulas, the joint proprietors, claiming to be a quarter-breed, not an Indian.

After receiving a permit from the police, they gave her a job as barmaid to sell their drinks. Constable Watkinson, Indian police, discovered what she was doing, and knowing her to be an Indian from the reserve at Port Simpson, arrested her for selling near beer. She was fined \$25 or three months in default. The charge against the men for letting an Indian do this was withdrawn.

WATER NOTICE USE AND STORAGE
