possible. A visitor to the Daily News office yesterday stated that he could build a good four-roomed house with bath for \$1,400. That placed on a good lot would cost in all \$2,000 perhaps. That would have to rent for about \$18 a month in order to pay ten per cent interest on the investment. Many good lots can be purchased for less money than the sum mentioned. A few lots may be worth more, but that seems to be about the average price present in a fair locality. Yet there are some people who say that house building would not pay.
