Better Counsels Have Prevailed.

It looks as if there would be no general strike in Great Britain. The people there are no Bolsheviks. They believe in law and order, and as long as they can secure what they consider their rights, they are satisfied.

Many people have been afraid of Lloyd George since he allied himself with the conservative element in the community, but those some conservatives are now about as liberal as Lloyd George once was.

What applies to Great Britain also applies here. Every man and woman except a tramp has a vote and all reforms can be obtained constitutionally.

It seems probable that some civic housing project is the only solution of the present pressing problem. So far as can be seen no other project will be sufficiently comprehensive to meet the present situation.

City Building Seems Probable Solution.
