OFFICERS FOR SWIMMING CLUB

Membership Fees Arranged and
Suggestions Made for Coming
Season's Activities.

At the meeting of the Swimming Club last night in the council chamber the new election of officers took place, also a discussion as to the membership fee, which will be one dollar for people over sixteen, and 25 cents under that age.

A suggestion was made to put in a sand beach at the lake and to try and make arrangements to get the children across the harbor at a cheaper rate than is being paid at the present time. A few other important matters were also brought up and discussed. One was to install a life boat at the lake and a few life belts for emergency purposes, which was considered a very wise move.

Swimming Instructions.

Another suggestion was made to instruct the local school children in life saving, lessons to proceed in the same manner as all schools of that nature.

J. C. McLennan spoke of the need of swimming for all children, and that transportation charges should be made as light as possible to encourage them in that line of sport.

Water Polo.

The popular game of water polo was also mentioned, and arrangements will be made to encourage this well known sport.

PLAGUE TAKES MANY ON CANADIAN COAST

Whole Population Wiped Out At
Some Points in the Labrador.

St. John's March 28. — More details of the plague ravages of Labrador have been received.

From Gross Water Bay to Nain the epidemic raged for four months, carrying off 50 per cent of the inhabitants. At Nain, 40 Newfoundlanders who wintered for the purpose of trade, succumbed and 40 Esquimaux died, practically the whole population of that settlement.

Okala with a population of over 200 was entirely wiped out. At At Hebron 200 died, leaving a remnant of residents to dispose of the bodies.
