WOULD PROHIBIT ALL UNSEEMLY DANCES

Bill in Alaska Legislature to Prohibit "Bunny Hug" Referred to Game Committee.

Juneau, March 28 .- A bill to prohibit the "Bunny Hug," "Turkey Trot," and "other immoral and suggestive dances," introduced in the House by Mr. Nordale for its "author," Mr. Collins, was the first joke put over on any of the members on the floor of the House since the beginning of the Fourth Session. After it was read, it was referred by Speaker White to the Committee on Roads, and later, upon suggestion of Mr. Collins, to the Committee on Game, though Mr. Sowerby, chairman of the latter committee, disclaimed any knowledge of the 'game" mentioned in the bill. Under the Table.

After a spirited discussion regarding the proper disposal of the bill, Mr. Pennington, who was l seconded by Mr. Dunn, moved that it "be put under the table." Though there were several dissenting votes, Mr. Pennington's motion carried and the bill was "put under the table."

The bill, as introduced, follows: "An Act to prohibit certain dances commonly called the 'Grizzly Bear,' 'Turkey Trot,' 'Snake Wrestle,' 'Bunny Hug,' and other suggestive and immoral dances and to provide a penalty for the violation of the Act and declaring an emergency.
