#### WHAT COALITION?


Yesterday a successful local businessman who is also keenly interested in politics was asked what he thought or the propoed coalition movement. He gave a grunt of disapproval and asked: "What coalition? Shall we coalesce with the people whose policy we heartily disapprove, who have proved themselves incompetent and whose aims and objects in life are as far from ours as is the east from the west? Coalition with these people would be more than foolish. It would be almost criminal. If they had either policy or personality they would have shown it during the past few years during which they have had the administration of affairs in their hands with a huge majority in the legislature to back them up. Such a coalition would be unthinkable for Liberals who value their principles or their characters."

This man then made a suggestion in regard to coalition which is wholly different from the proposals made in the south. It is that a coalition should be arranged between Liberal and Labor groups for the purpose of bringing CANADIANS about a saner condition and attacking the system which CANADIANS has brought such disaster to the world. "Mind you, I am not suggesting that we should join with the Reds," he disclaimed. "We are a different people from those who have adopted the Soviet system, and yet we may learn many lessons from them. We must evolve our own system suited to our own people and it will be for the Liberals and moderate Labor people to bring it about. We can never expect anything from the group now in power and we could not expect anything from the new lineup being manipulated from Shaughnessy Heights. What is necessary now is a complete turnover. We cannot compromise with evil, without being contaminated. Coalesce with the present administration? No. Clean them out through the joint efforts of Liberal and Labor parties and then get down to a sane administration in the interests of the people and not of the chosen few."
