

# BUILDING FOR

Light Record This Year Compared With Last, But Increase is Expected.

The building permits for the month of March amounted to only \$6,000 while for February there was a blank. In January permits were issued to the value of \$18,-000. It is expected now that there will be an immense addition to the amount during the remainder of the year.

## Permits for 1918.

The permits for 1918 totalled

\$50,901 for buildings other than those on the waterfront. Those on the waterfront amounted to \$55,400, making a total of building improvements last year of \$106,301.
