WATER ACT, 1914. RIPARIAN RIGHTS

NOTICE is hereby given that under the provisions of Section 6 of the Water Act, 1914, every riparian proprietor claiming a right to divert water or to the exclusive use of water for any purpose by virtue only of his being such riparian proprietor is required on or before the first day of June, 1920, to file a statement of claim setting forth the particulars of his claim.
