### LAND REGISTRY ACT.

(Sections 36 and 134.)

Application No. 10,554-1. File 6082.  
TAKE NOTICE that application has been made to register Frank W. Hart, of Prince Rupert, B. C., as owner in fee under a Tax Deed from the Collector of the City of Prince Rupert, bearing date the 9th day of December, 1918, of ALL AND SINGULAR premises situate, lying, and being in the City of Prince Rupert, more particularly shown and described as Lot twenty (20), Block Sixteen (16), Section Six (6), City of Prince Rupert (Map 923).  
You are required to contest the claim of the tax purchaser within 35 days from the date of the service of this notice (which may be effected by publication in the daily newspaper), and your attention is directed to section 36 of the "Land Registry Act" amendments, and to the following extract therefrom:—  
"And in default of a caveat or certificate of persons being filed before the registration as owner of the person entitled under such tax sale, all persons so served with notice, and those claiming through or under them, and all persons claiming any interest in the land by virtue of any unregistered instrument, and all persons claiming any interest in the land under the provisions of this Act, shall be deemed to have accepted the sale, and shall be bound by the provisions of this Act, and shall be liable to pay the taxes and to be sold for the same, and the Registrar shall register the person entitled under such tax sale as owner of the land so sold for taxes."

## HALIBUT HAS GOOD RECORD DURING MARCH

Catch in Advance of Last Year  
In Spite of the Cold Storage Tieup.

The halibut sales for the month of March amounted to 1,192,800 lbs. This is slightly larger than for the same month last year in spite of the fact that the Cold Storage boats were all tied up. Had they been operating it is possible that the catch for the month would have been half a million pounds more.

The prices for the month varied from 14.3 for first class and 11.5 for second class to 10.5 for first class and 8c. for second class. The sales for the month averaged 11.897c.

## STEAMER MONTEAGLE AFIRE AT HONG KONG

Well Known C. P. R. Liner was to Fetch Canadian Troops From Siberia.

San Francisco, April 12.—The C. P. R. steamship Monteagle, which was requisitioned by the Government to bring back Canadian and American troops from Siberia, is reported afire at Hong Kong harbor.

She left Vancouver with passengers and freight several weeks ago and on discharging at Hong Kong was to have proceeded to Vladivostok. She is a second class passenger ship with large accommodation for freight and is usually known as the missionary ship because of the large number of missionaries that travel by her.
