Forget Politics And Work Together.

"It is time that the people of Alaska forgot politics for a while and went earnestly to work for the purpose of restoring satisfactory business conditions." That was the advice given to the people of Juneau by Andrew Nerland formerly mayor of Fairbanks, as quoted in the Alaska Daily Empire. The advice is so timely that we pass it on to the people of British Columbia as equally applicable here.

There is no intention to suggest that the people here have been playing politics, for that seems to be the last thing most people have been thinking about of late. So far as we have been able to discover, Prince Rupert people have had all the politics they want for a few years and are now thinking about business.

At the same time it is difficult to let pass such an interesting bit of advice, particularly when the man who gave it was formerly a politician himself and a member of the territorial legislature.

Unite to Advance Our Own Interests.

Everyone should take a keen interest in the public affairs of the province, and that is politics, but public affairs must give way sometimes. Just now we are more interested in the affairs of Prince Rupert than of anything else, for it is an important juncture in the life of the city. We can unite on everything which will advance our own interests. The better we work together the more we are likely to increase our own prosperity.

There is evidenced everywhere a desire to work as a unit for the common good. We are making progress. There may come times when we shall be divided on public questions, but in all that concerns our own welfare we should stick together. We have all the rest of the country in competition with us. For years we have been held back, largely through unhappy divisions at home. By showing a united front we are likely to make an impression on the outside. Unity of purpose combined with plenty of vigor will carry us a long way.

Grain Westward Via Prince Rupert.

There is a good deal of discussion going on in regard to the hauling of grain westward instead of eastward. It is declared on no less an authority than Grant Hall, vice-president of the C. P. R., that the western route is feasible. He means of course the western route by way of the C. P. R.

If the western route by the C. P. R. is feasible, how much more must the Grand Trunk Pacific route with its low grades be a profitable way of getting the grain off the prairies. All northern Alberta, at any rate, should send its crop through this city and then to Europe by way of the Panama Canal. The difference in distance from here over Vancouver by the water route is not enough to make any appreciable additional cost, whereas the easy grade of the railway is a very material matter.

Small Margin of Safety in War.

The margin of safety in the war was so small that ever so slight advantage might have changed the whole political aspect of the world. The report of Sir Douglas Haig confirms the belief that has been held for some time, that the Allies were very nearly beaten in at least one stage of the war. What would have been the result had the Kaiser and his hosts overrun the world it is difficult even to surmise.

The more we look back at the days when the Allies were being driven from city to city and when the Hun was carrying everything before him, the more we feel indebted to the men who did the fighting for us overseas. Theirs is the triumph and the satisfaction that comes from feeling that they were instrumental in saving us from the crushing heel of the Beast of Berlin.

WATER ACT, 1914.

RIPARIAN RIGHTS

NOTICE is hereby given that under the provisions of Section 6 of the Water Act, 1914, every riparian proprietor claiming any right to divert water or to the exclusive use of water for any purpose by virtue only of his being such riparian proprietor is required on or before the first day of June, 1920, to file a statement of claim setting forth the particulars of his claim.
