Concentration Plant Being Installed Similar to That at Silver Standard.

With the incorporation of the Skeena Mining and Milling Company, the organization is now completed for the active carrying out of the plans by the company recently taking over the Coronado and Victory properties, says the Interior News. It is a private company and is incorporated for \$250,000, all of which is taken up by the members of the company, and there is no stock for sale to \*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\* the public. M. T. Watt is president and the vice-presidents are D. H. Nelson of New Westminster and J. W. Stewart of Bounty, Sask. T. B. Stewart of Vancouver as secretary, and A. J. Fowlie of San Francisco as treasurer are the other officers.

The power is being taken from Sloan and Halley creeks and will be diverted at a point about 1500 feet from the compressor site near the No. 2 tunnel on the Victory. The plant is capable of furnishing 100 h. p. and will provide ample leeway for increasing

the mill capacity. The concentration plant is almost a duplicate of the plant now in operation at the Silver Standard mine at New Hazelton, differing only in improved rolls. Although the terms of the bond called for the immediate establishment of a 25-ton mill, the company decided this would not meet requirements and have ordered a piant of double that output and specially constructed to provide for the addition of other units to increase the capacity to 100 tons per day.

#### SYNOPSIS OF LAND ACT AMENDMENT

Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes and which is non-timber land. Partnership pre-emptions abolished, but parties of not more than four may arrange for adjacent pre-emptions, with joint residence, but each making necessary improvements on respective claims.

Pre-emptors must occupy claims for five years and make improvements to value of \$10 per acre, including clearing and cultivation of at least 5 acres, before receiving Crown Grant.

Where i demptor in occupation not less than 3 years, and has made proportionate improvements, he may, because of ill-health or other cause, be granted intermediate certificate of improvement and transfer his claim. Records without permanent residence may be issued provided applicant makes improvements to extent of \$300 per an-num and records same each year. Fail-

ure to make improvements or record same will operate as forfeiture. Title cannot be obtained on these claims in less than 5 years, with improvements of \$10 per acre, including 5 acres cleared and cultivated, and residence of at Pre-emptor holding Crown Grant may

record another pre-emption, if he re-quires land in conjunction with his farm, without actual occupation, pro-vided statutory improvements made and residence maintained on Crown granted Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 20

title to be obtained after fulfilling residential and improvement conditions.

For grazing and industrial purposes, areas exceeding 640 acres may be leased by one person or company. PRE-EMPTORS' FREE GRANTS ACT.

The scope of this Act is enlarged to include all persons joining and serving with His Majesty's Forces. The time within which the heirs or devisees of a title under this Act is extended from one year from the death of such person, as formerly, until one year after the conclusion of the present war. This privilege is also made retroactive. TOWNSITE PROPERTY ALLOTMENT

Provision is made for the grant to persons holding uncompleted Agree-ments to Purchase from the Crown of such proportion of the land, if divisible, cover in proportion to the sale price of the whole parcel. Two or more persons their interests and apply for a proporconsidered advisable to divide the land covered by an application for a propor-tionate allotment, an allotment of land of equal value selected from available Crown lands in the locality may be upon payment of all taxes due the Crown or to any municipality. The of persons to whom the purchaser from the Crown has agreed to sell are also protected. The decision of the Minister of Lands in respect to the adjustment of a proportionate allotment is final. The time for making application for these allotments is limited to the 1st day of May, 1919. Any applica-tion made after this date will not be considered.
