**SUNDAY SALES OF HALIBUT AND SALMON**

Twenty-Six Catches Disposed of Here to Local Buyers—Nine Are Salmon.

Seventeen halibut and nine salmon boats sold their catches yesterday noon at the Fish Exchange at the following prices:

The Kodiak with 20,000 pounds and the Cora, 7,000 sold at 14.5c. and 7c. to the Booth Fisheries.  
N. Cape, 1,000 lbs.; Nidaros, 11,000, and Clara, 12,000 lbs. to Booth Fisheries, Ltd., at 15.1c. and 7c.

Grayling, 17,000 lbs.; Lancing, 8,000, to Royal Fish Company at 15.1c. and 7c. per lb.

**MINING COMPANY IS INCORPORATED**

Concentration Plant Being Installed Similar to That at Silver Standard.

With the incorporation of the Skeena Mining and Milling Company, the organization is now completed for the active carrying out of the plans by the company recently taking over the Coronado and Victory properties, says the Interior News. It is a private company and is incorporated for \$250,000, all of which is taken up by the members of the company, and there is no stock for sale to the public. M. T. Watt is president and the vice-presidents are D. H. Nelson of New Westminster and J. W. Stewart of Bountly, Sask. T. B. Stewart of Vancouver as secretary, and A. J. Fowlie of San Francisco as treasurer are the other officers.

The power is being taken from Sloan and Halley creeks and will be diverted at a point about 1500 feet from the compressor site near the No. 2 tunnel on the Victory. The plant is capable of furnishing 100 h. p. and will provide ample leeway for increasing the mill capacity.

The concentration plant is almost a duplicate of the plant now in operation at the Silver Standard mine at New Hazelton, differing only in improved rolls. Although the terms of the bond called for the immediate establishment of a 25-ton mill, the company decided this would not meet requirements and have ordered a plant of double that output and specially constructed to provide for the addition of other units to increase the capacity to 100 tons per day.

**SYNOPSIS OF LAND ACT AMENDMENT**

Pre-emption now confined to surveyed lands only.

Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes and which is non-timber land. Partnership pre-emptions abolished, but parties of not more than four may arrange for adjacent pre-emptions, with joint residence, but each making necessary improvements on respective claims.

Pre-emptors must occupy claims for five years and make improvements to value of \$10 per acre, including clearing and cultivation of at least 5 acres, before receiving Crown Grant.

Where a pre-emptor in occupation not less than 5 years, and has made proportionate improvements, he may, because of ill-health or other cause, be granted intermediate certificate of improvement and transfer his claim.

Records without permanent residence may be issued provided applicant makes improvements to extent of \$300 per annum and records same each year. Failure to make improvements or record same will operate as forfeiture. Title cannot be obtained on these claims in less than 5 years with improvements of \$10 per acre, including 5 acres cleared and cultivated, and residence of at least 2 years.

Pre-emptor holding Crown Grant may record another pre-emption, if he requires land in conjunction with his farm, without actual occupation, provided statutory improvements made and residence maintained on Crown granted land.

Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 20 acres, may be leased as homesteads; title to be obtained after fulfilling residential and improvement conditions. For grazing and industrial purposes, areas exceeding 640 acres may be leased by one person or company.

**PRE-EMPTORS' FREE GRANTS ACT.**

The scope of this Act is enlarged to include persons joining and serving with His Majesty's Forces. The time within which the heirs or devisees of a deceased pre-emptor may apply for title under this Act is extended from one year from the death of such person, as formerly, until one year after the conclusion of the present war. This privilege is also made retroactive.

**TOWNSITE PROPERTY ALLOTMENT ACT.**

Provision is made for the grant to persons holding uncompleted Agreements to Purchase from the Crown of such proportion of the land, if divisible, as the payments already made will cover in proportion to the sale price of the whole parcel. Two or more persons holding such Agreements may group their interests and apply for a proportionate allotment jointly. If it is not considered advisable to divide the land covered by an application for a proportionate allotment, an allotment of land of equal value selected from available Crown lands in the locality may be made. These allotments are conditional upon payment of all taxes due the Crown or to any municipality. The rights of persons to whom the purchase from the Crown has agreed to sell are also protected. The decision of the Minister of Lands in respect to the allotment of a proportionate allotment is final. The time for making application for these allotments is limited to the 1st day of May, 1919. Any application made after this date will not be considered. These allotments apply to town lots and lands of the Crown sold at public auction.
