POLITICAL STRIKE IS ON IN GERMANY

Railwaymen Join Dock and Factory Workers at Danzig to Establish Soviet.

Copenhagen, April 13.—A despatch from Danzig says that railwaymen declared a political strike Thursday with the object of removing the Ebert-Scheidemann government, establishing a soviet republic and entering into relations with the soviet governments of Russia and Hungary.

Twenty thousand dock and factory workers in Danzig district are on strike.

CHINESE STUDENTS PROVE TO BE BOGUS

Large Number Deported on Empress of Asia for Hong Kong.

Victoria, April 13.—The largest number of Chinese ever deported in a batch sailed on the outgoing Empress of Asia. Twenty-seven were destined for Victoria, but of these 24 proved bogus students and three bogus farmers. Seventeen destined to Vancouver were bogus students. They were sent back to Hong Kong.

KILLED IN EXPLOSION AT COLD STORAGE

Winnipeg, April 13.—W. S. Milne, superintendent, and W. Pattison, engineer, were suffocated following an explosion last night in the Manitoba Cold Storage plant. On inspecting a few minutes after the employees left at six o'clock a terrific explosion occurred. Ammonia fumes prevented rescue even with gas masks. The bodies are still unrecovered.

MANY FURS SELL AT HIGHER PRICES

New York, April 13.—The Fur Auction Sales Corporation announces the following changes in prices at sales held compared with the January, 1919, sales. Beaver ten per cent higher, fisher 60 per cent higher, Russian sable 30 per cent higher, blue fox 25 per cent higher, wolverine no change. There were large offerings of silver fox at continuous high quotations.

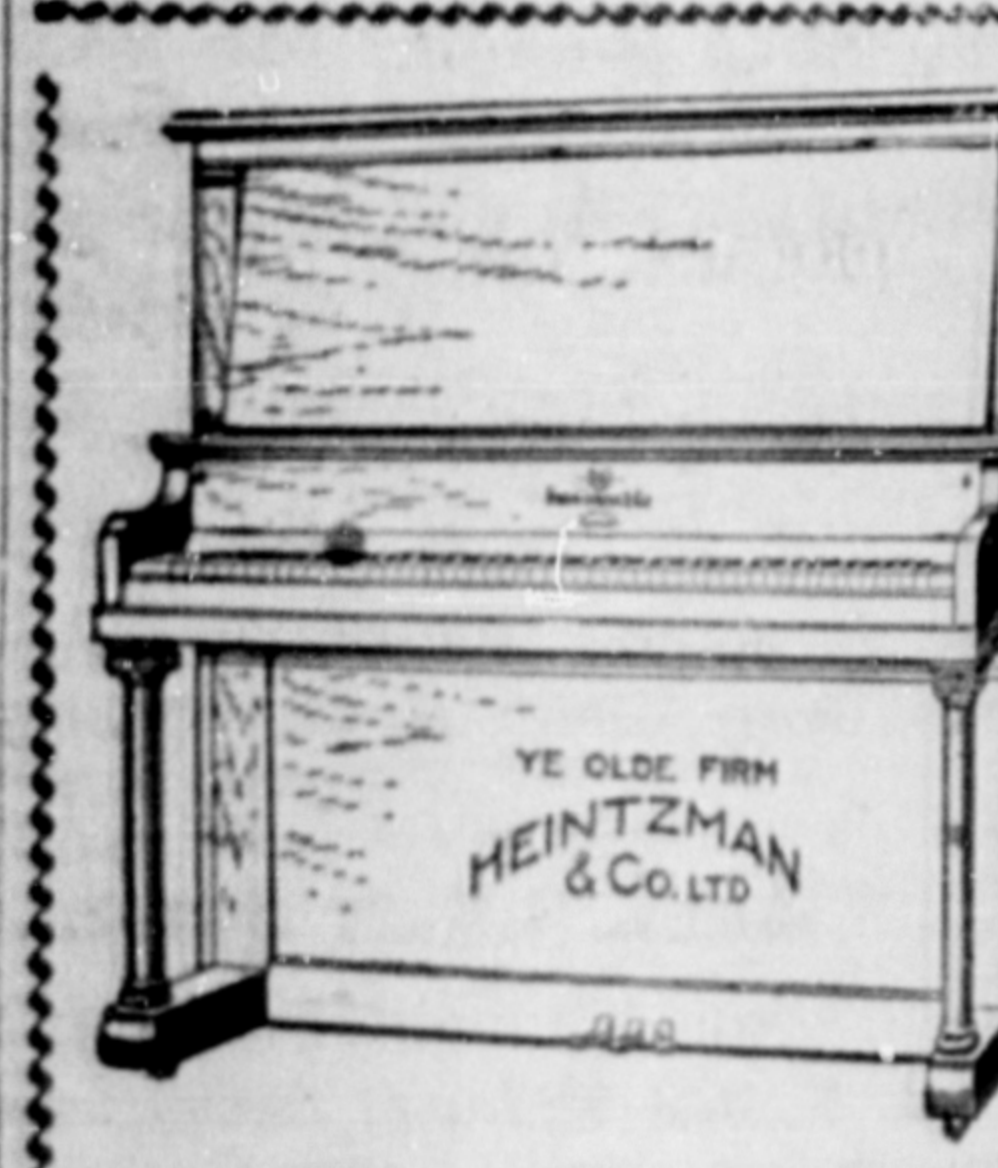
