### Always Right to the Front, He Told Vancouver Interviewer, Supplying Smokes and Drinks.

CAPT. MCGREGOR

TELLS OF WORK

WINNING CROSS ONE OF FINEST FEATS OF WAR

(By mail.)

Vancouver, April 24.—Captain J. McGregor, V. C., D. C. M., M. C., one of Canada's greatest and most modest heroes, was sitting in the Red Cross Triangle Club swapping yarns with Tom Armit, D. C. M., of their days together in the 2nd C. M. R. "Mac," as the boys call him, is ranked a hero even among the men of the 2nd C. M. R. which boasts of over two hundred decorations and innumerable valorous deeds which went unrecognized. With a clean, frank and open countenance which, however, shows a world of strength and determination, it is not hard to understand that this quiet, unassuming young Scotchman could develop a righteous fury that would carry him through as many Huns as could get in front of him.

#### Always Up to Front.

Although he will not talk of his own deeds, there is one thing of which he will talk quite freely, and that is the Canadian Y. M. C. A.
