Spiritualistic Seance With Benjamin Franklin.

Having no particular message for the people of Prince Rupert the editor last night went into a trance, called up the shades of Benjamin Franklin and conversed with him and the following wise sayings were among those which were communicated to him by the great American:

"Wouldst thou enjoy a long life, a healthy body and a vigorous mind and be acquainted also with the wonderful works of God? Labor in the first place to bring thy appetite in subjection to reason."

"I am convinced that truth, sincerity and integrity in dealings between man and man are of the utmost importance to the felicity of life."

"If you teach a young man to shave himself and keep his razor in order, you may contribute more to the happiness of his life than in giving him a thousand guineas."

"It is much better to make good citizens than to make Methodists, Presbyterians or Catholics."

"We are not sure that we have arrived at the end of progression nor at the perfection of spiritual or theological knowledge. For this reason there is danger in printing our confession of faith lest we should feel ourselves bound and confined by it and perhaps unwilling to receive further improvement and our successors still more so."

"Mankind are very odd creatures. One half censure what they practise and the other half practise what they censure; the rest always say and do as they ought."

"The use of money is all the advantage there is in having money."

"Be civil to all, sociable to many, familiar with few, friendly to one, enemy to none."

"Reading makes a full man, meditation a profound man, discourse a clear man." (Ben refused to give an opinion on the movies because he said he had never attended one.)

"Keep your eyes wide open before marriage, half shut afterwards."

"Kings and bears often worry their keepers."

"Men differ daily about things which are subject to sense. Is it likely then that they should agree about things invisible?"

"If you'd lose a troublesome visitor, lend him money."

"Let thy maidservant be faithful, strong and homely."

"It would be a hard government that should tax its people one tenth part of their time to be employed in its service. But idleness taxes many of us much more, if we reckon all that is spent in absolute sloth, or doing nothing, with that which is spent in idle employments or amusements that amount to nothing. Sloth, by bringing on disease, absolutely shortens life. Sloth like rust consumes faster than labor wears; while the used key is always bright. Dost thou love life? Then do not squander time for that is the stuff life is made of."

WATER ACT, 1914.

RIPARIAN RIGHTS

NOTICE is hereby given that under the provisions of Section 6 of the Water Act, 1914, every riparian proprietor claiming any right to divert water or to the exclusive use of water for any purpose by virtue only of his being such riparian proprietor is required on or before the first day of June, 1920, to file a statement of claim setting forth the particulars of his claim. Such statements of claim shall be filed in duplicate with the Water Recorder of the Water District in which the water is diverted or used.

After the first day of June, 1920, no right to divert water or to the exclusive use of water for any purpose shall exist by virtue only of any ownership of land. Forms of statement of claim can be obtained from the Water Recorders of the several Water Districts in the Province or from the Comptroller of Water Rights, Parliament Buildings, Victoria, B. C.
