WATER NOTICE

USE AND STORAGE

TAKE NOTICE that Pacific Coast Exploration Co., Ltd., whose address is Toronto, Ont., will apply for a licence to take and use 200 cubic feet per second and to store 4,000 acre feet or 174,240,000 cubic feet of water out of Cascade and Silver Creeks (streams), also known as draining Long Lake and other small lakes in the vicinity of the Big Missouri Group, which flows in southwesterly direction and drains into the International Boundary Line.

The storage-dam will be located at Long Lake and other small lakes adjacent. The capacity of the reservoir to be created is about 200,000,000 cubic ft., and it will flood about 400 acres of land, (all rock).
