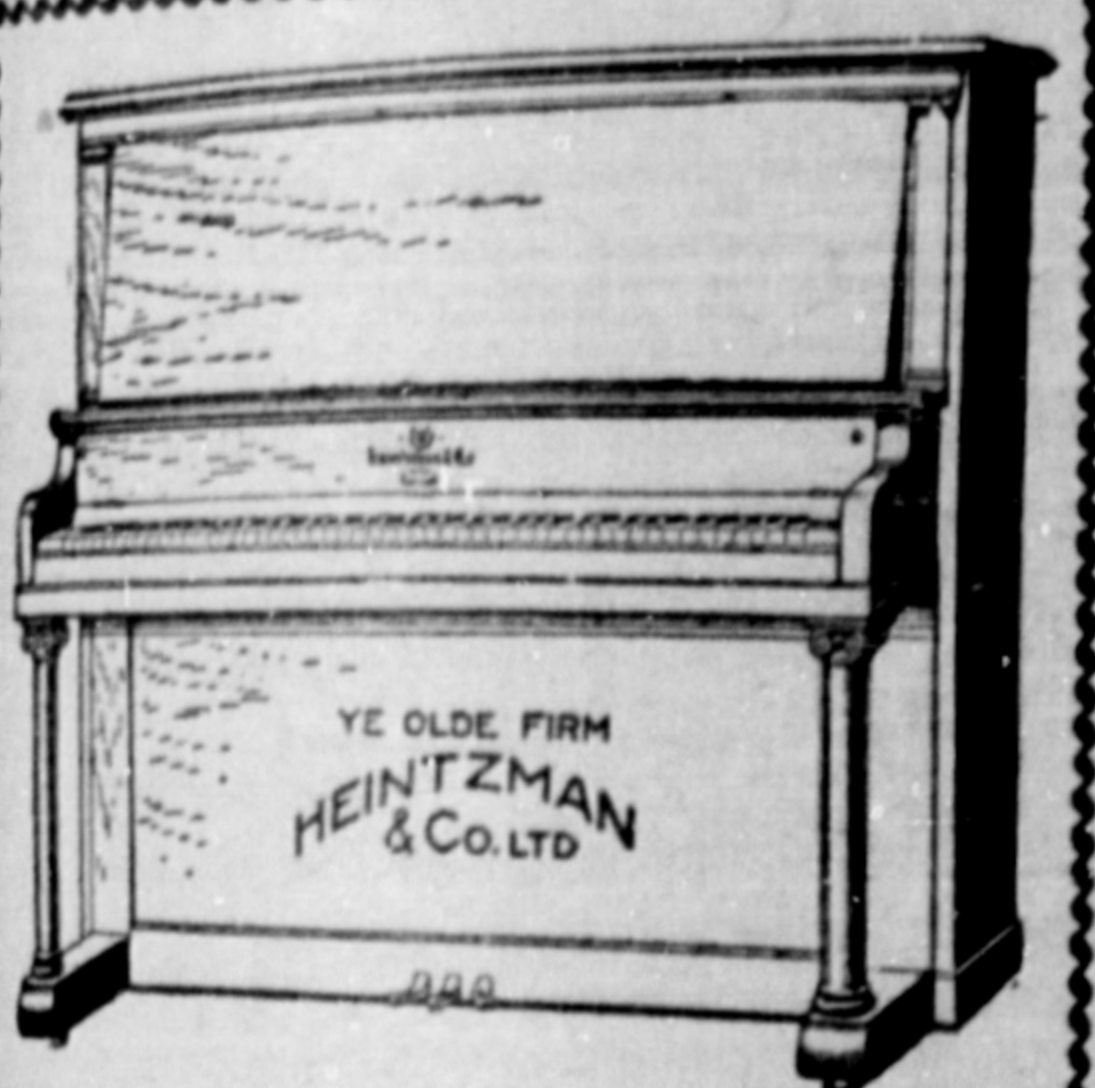

CANCELLATION OF RESERVE OF WATER

MANY DIED FROM HUNGER IN GERMANY

So Says Imperial Health Ministry In Memorandum—Blockade Was Fatal.

(Special via G. T. P. Telegraphs.)
Berlin, April 26.—The Imperial Health Ministry has issued a memorandum on the results of the blockade. It says, from 1915 to 1918 as a result of under nourishment 673,000 persons died in Germany and a further 150,000 died from influenza owing to loss of power of resistance. The fall in the number of births during the war exceeded 4,000,000 for the Empire and over 2,500,000 for Prussia.
The memorandum calculates at 56,300,000,000 marks the damage inflicted by the hunger blockade.

VOICE EXPERT AND FLYING MAN COMING

Arthur J. Foxall of Vancouver to Give Short Course Here.

There is no particular relation between flying and music, but Arthur J. Foxall of Vancouver who is coming here soon is an air man and a singer and voice expert of repute. He proposes opening a studio here for a short summer school course in vocal training. He has a school of music in Vancouver but he is leaving it for a short time to give Prince Rupert vocalists an opportunity to train.

Mr. Foxall is president of the Air Service Association of British Columbia and while here wishes to meet former members of the air forces with a view to a possible establishment of a local branch.
