### HUMOR AND PATHOS IN "THE BETTER 'OLE"

Old Bill, Bert and Alf Typify the Spirit of True British Soldier; Picture at Westholme.

That Capt. Bairnsfather's play, so successfully produced in London and New York, offered really magnificent opportunities to the film producer had long been obvious, for there are many incidents which, though they cannot appear on the stage, yet come within the scope of the film, and fill up the interstices of the story to the greater satisfaction of the onlooker. From the very start when a picture of the Three Musketeers of the olden time, in the picturesque panoply of their period, dissolved into the three soldiers of today—"Old Bill," "Bert" and "Alf" in the trenches, the missing details of the play are filled in with a constructive skill which adds enormously to the true understanding of the story.

The introduction of the "poet soldier" as a sort of explanatory "chorus" is one of the happiest touches and few could not feel their heart strings drawn tighter at the section of the film which showed how "the whisper of war" descended upon all British homes from the lowliest to the highest in the land. "The Better 'Ole" will be shown at the Westholme today and tomorrow.

### 300,000,000 WAR CERTIFICATES SOLD IN GREAT BRITAIN

Splendid Record Made by War Savings Committee During Three Years—Still Carrying On.

In the United Kingdom the War Savings campaign has been a great success and will be continued on a peace basis. The third anniversary of the inauguration of the movement was, on March 1, made the occasion for the issuing by the National War Savings Committee of a statement setting forth the work done since the latter end of February, 1916, as well as announcing plans for the future. From the statement the following has been reproduced.

"During almost exactly three years, 300,000,000 War Savings Certificates have been sold. During the first two years to March 1, 1918, 158,803,447 certificates were sold, or an average of 79,401,723. During the third year to March 1, 1919, 142,353,201 were sold, being nearly double the average for the previous two years. This progress of the sales is the more remarkable when it is realized that no individual may hold more than 500 certificates, and, consequently, the number of purchasers is being steadily reduced.

"It is, however, important that it should be understood that the raising of money for the State was not the main object for which the National War Savings Committee was established. The primary object of the committee was to secure for the nation all the benefits which would accrue from the successful establishment of a safe, convenient and profitable method of investment for people of small means, rather than the more narrow object of merely raising money to pay for the war. It is in this direction that lies the important social aspect of the movement, a movement which promises to become of permanent benefit to the wage-earner.

### WATER ACT, 1914. RIPARIAN RIGHTS

NOTICE is hereby given that under the provisions of Section 6 of the Water Act, 1914, every riparian proprietor claiming any right to divert water or to the exclusive use of water for any purpose by virtue of his being such riparian proprietor is required on or before the first day of June, 1920, to file a statement of claim setting forth the particulars of his claim. Such statements of claim shall be filed in duplicate with the Water Recorder of the Water District in which the water is diverted or used.  
After the first day of June, 1920, no right to divert water or to the exclusive use of water for any purpose shall exist by virtue only of any ownership of land. Forms of statement of claim can be obtained from the Water Recorder of the several Water Districts in the Province or from the Comptroller of Water Rights, Parliament Buildings, Victoria, B. C.
