Failure to Greet Returning Soldiers.

A correspondent charges that Prince Rupert people have been very remiss in their duties in the matter of greeting returned soldiers generally, and this was only accentuated by the spasm of Sunday.

Unfortunately the charge is true to a very large extent. It has been found difficult to get information in regard to men returning here, but it is possible if sufficient effort had been made this could have been overcome.

There is certainly no excuse for the careless manner in which we have allowed many of our best men to drift back unwelcomed, except by a few friends.

In this city we are apt to get excited and then forget all about the matter just as we did with the housing and other schemes. The soldiers have a just complaint undoubtedly, and there is nothing to justify it.

Swimming Club Conditional Grant.

The City Council made a superbly silly decision last night when it decided to grant the Swimming Club the sum of \$500 conditional on the Provincial Government granting a like amount. It seems as if the Provincial Government would be so keen to see the city come through with their mite that they would be sure to put up an equal share.

Imagine John Oliver being influenced by an argument of that kind. The local council may think the Provincial Government a group of kids, but they are not that small. Prince Rupert will get a Provincial grant for the improvement of the Salt Lakes if the Government can be shown that it is a worthy object, but they certainly will not be influenced by what action the City Council also takes.

Somebody in the Council is probably springing a joke, and the other aldermen have not noticed it. At any rate it is inconceivable that the city would withhold its grant even if the Province fails to grant a similar amount. The work at the lakes should be done at once and not be allowed to wait until the season is over. The mayor and aldermen talked fair when the delegation was present, but they do not seem to have meant it, judging by their action last night.

Satisfactory Work At City Park.

The work at the city park is one of the most satisfactory bits of improvement the City Council has made in many a day. The park is picturesquely laid out and the place is bound to become popular as soon as the warmer weather comes. Already it is used a good deal.

While the bridges might have been more picturesque, if made with rustic effect from the timber cut on the ground, they will soon weather and conform to the general color scheme of the place.

The park is an ideal one for children and when the walks are completed will compare favorably with the parks in larger cities. The natural effect of the stream and wood is so good that a great improvement is made at very small expense. Later the improvements can be continued so that in time the public park at Prince Rupert will be unequalled.

One thing must be carefully guarded against, and that is the pollution of the stream. When a stream flows through a city it is difficult to keep it pure. For a stream flowing through a park, however, this is essential.
