Local News Notes

H. G. Creelman, of Stewart, arrived in town yesterday.

The Canadian Fish & Cold Storage Company's trawler G. E. Foster went out yesterday evening.

The resignation of Weston Coyne as weigh clerk was accepted last night and it was decided to advertise for a successor.

The Prince Rupert Supply Co. last night received the contract for supplying brass goods, pipe fittings, etc., to the city. The price being \$976.88.

The Ladies Auxiliary of the G. W. V. A. will hold their last general meeting before the summer vacation as usual at 8 p. m. tomorrow, Wednesday, May 14.

The perennial Borden St. water supply was once more discussed by the City Council at its meeting last night and referred once more to the engineer for further report.

The contract for 700,000 feet of lumber for the use of the city was let last night to the Lakelse Lumber Co. for \$14,675 and allowing one dollar a thousand for loading.

A complaint regarding the way meat was handled was made at the meeting of the City Council last night. It was charged that often it was carried in coal wagons.

A letter was received by the City Council last night from Mrs. Carss thanking the Mayor and Council for the kind expressions of sympathy during the time of her recent bereavement.

In the current issue of the British Columbia Gazette it is announced that the incorporation has taken place of the Port Clements Box & Lumber Co., Ltd., a private concern with a capital of \$50,000 and with registered office at Port Clements.

Communications from L. W. Patmore as counsel for the Canadian General Electric Co., was read and discussed at the City Council meeting last night. It was decided to refer the matter to W. E. Williams who is acting for the city, but the view was generally expressed by the aldermen that they would stand by the position they had taken.

The matter of housing was discussed by the City Council for a few minutes last night. Alderman Perry mentioned the importance of providing for the people who are coming. It was pointed out that the city had no power to do anything, but that they were taking up with the Government the Dominion Housing scheme. The soldiers were anxious to have their houses built in Section 2.

A report from the Finance Committee to the City Council last night showed that up to a week ago the appropriation of \$500 made last year for park improvement had been exceeded by \$35 and recommended that another \$500 be granted this year. This amount would be exclusive of the cost of removing the log jam which would cost two to three hundred dollars and which it was necessary to remove anyway as it caused floods.

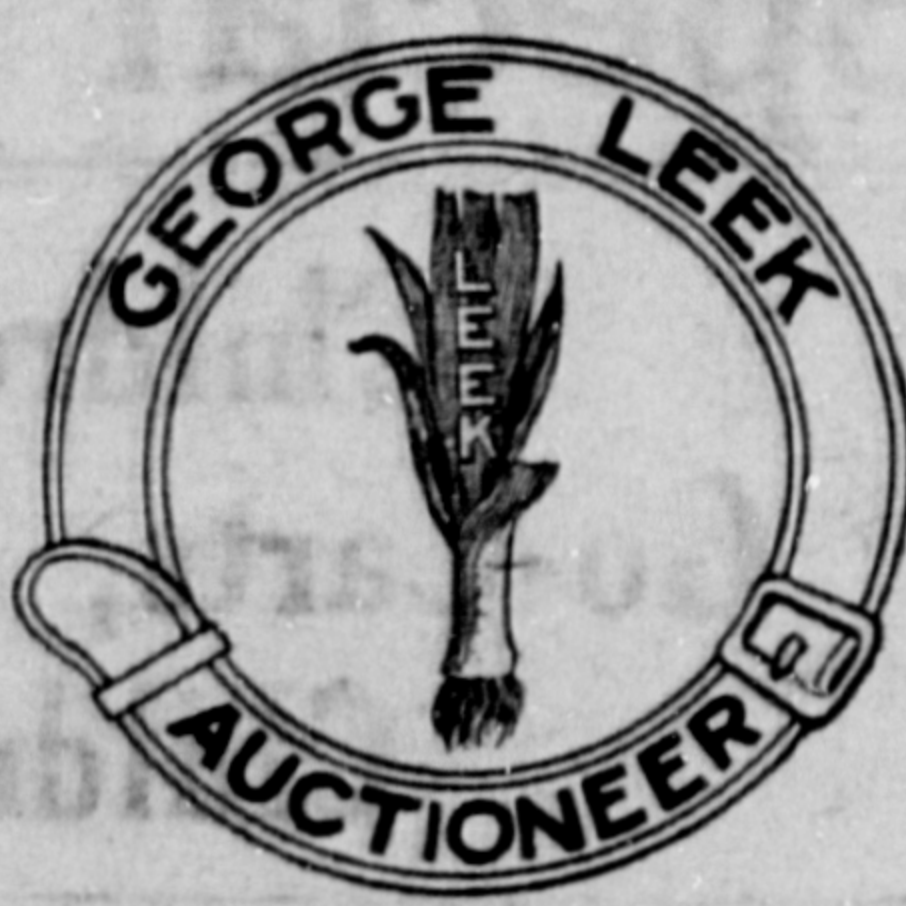
